THE BIRD SPECIES

01. Scopoli's Shearwater - Calonectris diomedea

Common at sea, giving nice views from the coast and on the pelagic

02. Yelkouan Shearwater - Puffinus yelkouan

About 8 birds seen spread over the days, while seabirding from the coast.

03. Mediterranean Stormpetrel – Hydrobates pelagicus ssp: melitensis

Seen on four times early morning sea watching (and not in the evening). A total of 27 birds seen, with one on the pelagic and 5/12/9 seen rom the visited headlands in the north west of the island of which this Mediterraans Stormvogeltje - Hydrobates pelagicus melitensis - Observation.org was the best. 04. (Western) Cattle Egret – Bubulcus ibis

10 birds seen in total, a little (partly feral?) Colony near Salina N.R. and a few birds out of sea flying in.

05. Little Egret – Egretta garzetta

A total of 20 birds seen, also at the (partly feral?) colony near Salina N.R.

06. Grey Heron – Ardea cinerea

A total of 11 birds seen on migration at various sites on the island.

07. Greater Flamingo – Phoenicopterus roseus

12-08 30 ex. in one flock during the pelagic, flying almost along the east coast of Malta.

08. Moorhen – Gallinula chloropus

1 bird seen during the stay.

09. Oystercatcher – Haematopus ostralegus

1 bird present the whole period at Chiandra

10. Black-winged Stilt – Himantopus himantopus

A total of 5 birds daily present at Salina N.R.

11. Little Ringed Plover - Charadrius dubius

2 birds in total at the visits to Chiandra N.R..

12. Little Stint – Calidris minuta

2 birds in total at the visits to Salina N.R.

13. Dunlin – Calidris alpina

1 adult summer at Salina N.R.

14. Green sandpiper - Tringa och

1 adult summer at Salina N.R.

15. Common Sandpiper – Actitis hypoleucos

Common at several places on the island.

16. Mediterranean Gull - Larus melanocephalus

12-08 1 subadult seen during the pelagic.

17. Audouin's Gull - Larus audouinii

12-08 1 juv. seen during the pelagic.

18. Yellow-legged Gull - Larus michahellis

Common along the coast with some late breeding colonies.

19. Sandwich Tern – Sterna sandvicensis

11-08 1 ex. flying along the coast.

20. Black Tern - Chlidonias niger

12-08 4 ex. seen during the pelagic.

21. Collared Dove - Streptopelia decaocto

Common throughout.

22. Common Swift - Apus apus

Common on migration in the mornings with big flocks.

23. Pallid Swift – Apus pallidus

11-08 1 ex. flying near Salina N.R and seen well.

24. White Wagtail - Motacilla alba

1 ex. at Salina N.R. with the Little Stints.

25. European Stonechat - Saxicola rubicola

About 4 birds at Chiandra N.R

26. Blue Rock Thrush - Monticola solitarius

2 birds, one nice male at the lost buildings near/of Pembroke.

27. Cetti's Warbler – Cettia cetti

About 4 birds heard and ringed at Buskett.

28. Zitting Cisticola – Cisticola juncidis

Very common on the island and also behaving different, more obvious than on other places I saw them.

29. Icertine Warbler – Hippolais icterina

13-08 -

1 ex. ringed at Buskett.

30. Eastern Subalpine Warbler - Sylvia cantillans ssp: cantillans

31. Moltoni's Warbler – Sylvia subalpina

13-08 - 1 ad. ringed at Buskett, smaller and with the known tail pattern. Great to see this species again after so many years and compare the tail patterns.



32. Sardinian Warbler – Sylvia melanocephala

Common throughout the trip, also ringed at Buskett.
