NORTH & CENTRAL INDIA

Punjab, Jaipur, Maharashtra, Gangetic plain, and Uttarakhand January-February 2019

Introduction

This report hold notes on birds, mammals and a few reptiles recorded during a five-week long visit to India 18/1-22/2 2019. The first three weeks was a roundtrip with my partner, Lene Smith, with focus on a number of cultural sites, which none of us has visited before – Amritsar, Jaipur (including 5 days attending the Jaipur Literature Festival), Mumbai, Ajanta Caves, Daulatabad, Ellora Caves and New Delhi. Two exceptions were a one-day visit to Harike wetland near Amritsar (20/1) and two days in Tansa Wildlife Sanctuary near Mumbai (31/1-1/2) – the latter visit was with a guide and primarily for seeing the recently rediscovered Forest Owlet. After the first three weeks, I continued alone for another two weeks: This included a nine-day visit to Corbett National Park and nearby foothills to Himalaya and some days in and around New Delhi with visits to Ohkla, Qutab Minar, Tughlagabad, Bhindawas and Sultanpur Jheel.

Observations is compiled under five subheadings:

<u>Amritsar</u>: Observations from Amritsar, Wagah and Harike. Only last locality was proper birding. <u>Jaipur</u>: Observations from various activities in town and one early morning visit to Jhalala Leopard Conservancy.

Maharashtra: Observations from Mumbai including boat-trip to Elephanta Island, two days of birding in Tansa Wildlife Sanctuary and three days of visits to cultural sites around Aurangabad (Ajanta Caves, Bibi-ka-Maqbara, Aurangabad Caves, Daulatabad Fort, Khuldabad (Tombs of Sufi saints), and Ellora Caves). Gangetic plain: Observations from visits to a number of cultural sites in New Delhi, from drive through Gangetic plain to/from Uttarakhand, and from birding visits to Ohkla Bird Sanctuary, Tughlaqabad, Sultanpur Jheel and Bhindawas.

<u>Uttarakhand</u>: Observations from Corbett National Park, sites around Kosi River by Ramnagar, Pangoot and Sat Tal.

Brief summary: Mammals: 28 species. Notable records are a superb female Tiger with three cubs and good numbers of Asian Elephants in Corbett NP, four different types Grey Langurs (subspecies or species?) and two nice species in the foothills to Himalayas: Himalayan Brown Goral and Mountain Weasel. - Birds: 361 species. Around Amritsar, a Kashmir Chiffchaff at Harike was a good find. In Maharashtra, good records were Heuglin's Gull and Taimyr Gull at Mumbai – the latter even with characters of Vega Gull. The visit to Tansa Wildlife Reserve provided the hoped for Forest Owlet – and Vigor's Sunbird – the Western Ghat endemic being a recent split from Crimson Sunbird. In Uttarakhand, a wealth of birds was recorded. In Corbett stars were Pallas's and Lesser Fish Eagles, Brown Fish Owl, an all too brief Long-billed Thrush and many others. Despite a concerted effort there was no Hodgson's Bush Chat to be found – this species seems absent in recent years. Around Kosi River a record of three Pale Martins was a surprise – and in particular as the birds seemed to attend nesting holes. In case, this could be a first breeding record from India. Perhaps, the species is overlooked? Other memorable birds were Ibisbill (1), Wallcreeper (2), Little Forktail (2), a tricky Himalayan Rubythroat and many others. Pangoot is well known for Koklass Pheasant and Upland Pipit, which were both found, while I missed the third Pangoot-classic, Cheer Pheasant. Long-billed Thrush was more cooperative here – the same bird seen three times. In Sat Tal, many of the characteristic Himalayan species were found including Mountain Wood Owl. End of stay at Sultanpur National Park was rich with Indian Courser, Sind Sparrow, and highly unexpected White-crowed Penduline Tit (2) and Variable Wheatear (1; opistholeuca-form). - Reptiles: Only 7 species. Indian reptiles are not prolific during winter.

All photos in the report are from the trip. An * by the name of a species indicates, that at least one photo of the species was obtained.

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Practical information

We booked flights and most accommodations on the internet – and it worked fine. Only problem was cancellation of the first leg of our booked flights Amritsar-New Delhi-Jaipur. It happened well in advance of our departure from Denmark, and became a rather convenient change as we instead could book a newly opened flight Amritsar-Dehra Dun-Jaipur so avoiding the risk of a smog-delay during a stopover in Delhi.

Our guide for Tansa WS and the car with driver from Mumbai to Aurangabad (7 days) was booked through Wild World India, whom we have used before.

My guide and the car with driver for the visit to Uttarakhand was booked through Asian Adventures. During my final days in Delhi, I used the same driver/car for various tasks.



Itinerary

17/1 Finnair flight from Copenhagen (13.15; GMT+1) to Helsinki (15.50; GMT+2). Departure Finnair flight from Helsinki (20.20; GMT+2)



- 18/1 Arrival in Delhi Airport (06.40; GMT+4½). Domestic flight New Delhi (scheduled 13:40 but delayed to 16.05) to Amritsar (arrival scheduled 14:50, but delayed to 17:20). Prepaid taxi to Hotel
- 19/1 By foot around centre of Amritsar with visit to the Golden Temple and Jallianwala Bagh. Afternoon by taxi to Silver temple and the Wagah border ceremony.
- 20/1 By taxi (06.05-18.15) to Harike, where we birded from 07.15 to 16.35. Visited neighbourhood of Sikh temple and walked 3.5 km along at the lake. Tried to reach areas east of the lake but found only intensive farmland. In mid-afternoon, we tried areas

- around the river to the west but a new high way crossing the river has changed everything and much of the dried-up river is open sand- and gravel-mines.
- 21/1 Day started with thunder. Took tuk-tuk to the park Ram Bagh and returned by tuk-tuk due to rain, which continued rest of the day. Saw the evening ceremony at the Golden Temple from the top of our hotel nice to have a telescope!
- 22/1 Early morning visit to Golden Temple and Partition Museum. Transfer to airport and flight to Jaipur via Dehra Dun flight delayed due to rain. Late afternoon landing in dry and sunny Jaipur.
- 23/1 Early morning check-in to Literature Festival, and met with friend Paul Patrick Cullen. Later an inflammation of the throat forced me to bed.
- 24/1 Lene to Literature Festival, while I stayed in bed.
- 25/1 We both participated in the Literature Festival and made a visit to the Palace of Winds.
- 26/1 All day at Literature Festival. Late afternoon walk to Central Park with pre-roosting Rosy Starlings.
- 27/1 Lene to Literature festival and I stayed in bed all day.
- 28/1 Early morning visit to Jhalana Leopard Conservancy with Paul but no spotted cats to be seen.
- 29/1 Domestic flight Jaipur to Mumbai (09.30-11.25). Transfer (female taxi driver) to hotel and short walk to India Gate. Rest of day in bed.
- 30/1 Took the ferry from India Gate to Elephanta Islands. Interesting gulls from the ferry.
- 31/1 Picked up by guide Gaurav Shirodkar (Sanctuary Asia) and driver Shiva Prasad. Drove to check-in at Midway Hotel and made late afternoon visit to Tansa WS. Heard Forest Owlet briefly.
- 1/2 Morning and afternoon visit to Tansa WS. Found Forest Owlet and saw it well in the morning.
- 2/2 Early morning visit to Tansa WS and farewell to guide Gaurav Shirodkar after successful help. By car to Aurangabad with stop at temples in Nashik. Drive to Aurangabad a little rough with roadwork along most of the way after Nashik.
- 3/2 All day to Ajanta Caves. Roadworks made the only 100 km to and fro a 2½-3 hour rough drive.
- 4/2 I felt miserable all morning, but late afternoon visit to Bibi-ka-Maqbara ('Baby Taj') and Aurangabad Caves.
- 5/2 All day visit to Daulatabad Fort and Khuldabad (Tombs of Sufi saints).
- 6/2 Morning and early afternoon visit to Ellora Caves. Then dropped at Aurangabad airport (17.20) and farewell to good driver Shiva Prasad. Flight to New Delhi (19.10-20.10). Transfer to hotel at Connaught took almost one hour due to roadworks and traffic jam.
- 7/2 Visit to National Museum on a rainy day and walked a little around centre.
- 8/2 Visit to Northern Ridge (walk through park and visit to Ashoka pillar and Mutini Memorial) and later to Humayun's Tomb.
- 9/2 LS: Start of return-flight to Denmark. UGS: Pick-up by driver Sandeep Kumar at 06.00 and drive to Tiger Camp (Ramnagar).
 Late afternoon visit to Kosi River by Gariya Temple and met later my guide for the comings days, Sunil Kumar.
- Picked up by driver Harish Patwal and had with Sunil Kumar an early transfer to Dhikala in Corbett National Park. Prolific birding all the way. Afternoon game drive to grassland and part of the forest with local guide Vijay Kumar.
- 11/2 Early morning game drive to forest and grassland north of the Dhikala again with local guide Vijay Kumar. Late morning transfer to Tiger Camp near Ramnagar. Afternoon walk along Kosi River around Gariya Temple.
- 12/2 Morning visit to sites along Kosi River upstream from Ramnagar Soral, Kumeria and Mohan. Afternoon transfer to Pangoot in foothills to Himalaya with birding at Kosi Barrage (Ramnagar) and short walk in Mongoli Valley. Above Naini Tal stop at viewpoints with reasonable view of snowclad Himalaya.
- 13/2 Early morning visit to Vinayak and birding the forest on the way back to Pangoot. Afternoon visit to Timla Bani.
- Early morning visit to Vinayak in miserable weather showers, thunder, and hailstorm. It cleared for a while and we tried again in vain to find the Cheer Pheasants. Afterwards we tried various stops in the forest but all day birding was difficult. Late afternoon a walk down a side road to the road towards Vinayak, but chilly and windy weather made me call it a day, as I was still coughing after my earlier sickness. Dramatic thunder during evening/night caused powercut.
- Clear sky from the morning. We went to Vinayak with good observations of Koklass Pheasant, Long-billed Thrush, and Upland Pipit but unfortunately again without Cheer Pheasants. In the afternoon, drive to next stop in Bhimtal. Found a working ATM in Bhimtal after having failed in Naini Tal. Birding on the way included a longer stop at Chaffi, where despite a drizzle birding was fine.
- The morning was rainy and birding in Sat Tal was slow but improved when the rain stopped mid-morning. Afternoon birding in the same areas was better, but the day ended with rain again.
- Early morning visit to Sat Tal in brilliant weather and birding was excellent. Then farewell to guide Sunil Kumar after days of excellent birding. Lunch at the hotel and start of long drive (10 hours) to Delhi with arrival 23.15 to hotel in Karol Bagh.
- 18/2 Walk around Karol Bagh and Connaught but otherwise a quiet day sending emails, writing notes etc.
- 19/2 Morning visit to Ohkla Sanctuary and early afternoon visit to Qutab Minar. Check-in at new Hotel.
- 20/2 Morning visit to Tughlaqabad Fort and by car to Bhindawas lake. Late afternoon arrival to Rosy Pelican Lodge by Sultanpur Jheel.
- 21/2 Morning by foot around Sultanpur Jheel and afternoon visit to nearby sites outside the national park. After sunset transfer to hotel near airport.
- Transfer to airport and farewell to dedicated and good driver, Sandeep Kumar. Finnair flight New Delhi (10.35; GMT+4½) to Helsinki (14.35; GMT+2). Finnair flight Helsinki (15.30; GMT+2) to Copenhagen (16.05; GMT+1).

Notes on sites

Harike. A barrage on the river Sutley creates this well-known wetland, which is packed with waterbirds during winter — but also suffers from water hyacinths and eutrophication (downstream the barrage, the irrigation canals looked like someone had taken a foam bath). Access to the lake proper is fairly straightforward and described by Kazmierczak (1990. A Birdwatchers Guide to India). Just south of the barrage, there is a parking lot by the entrance to a significant Sikh-temple. There is good birding options between the temple and lake (red tracks on the detailed map) and visitors are welcome (and in the morning, tea and biscuits is offered free). However, note that the temple-ground is fenced from the main reserve. To reach the main reserve from the parking lot, one has to take the road around the temple-ground (purple track on the detailed map). One can walk on the top of the dike along the shore — but with only occasional lookouts to the lake because of trees. A number of observation-towers was non-functional during our visit (often overgrown and mostly with no steps in the staircases) but this may be an interim situation as signboards indicated an on-going restoration project of visitor-facilities. We tried to reach the eastern shore as well — a bumpy road on the dike gives easy access but only poor view of the lake and inland we found extensive fields with no trace of any productive wet areas. Late afternoon we tried to follow a track described in Kazmierczak (1990) along the northern shore of Sutley river, but failed to find it - a new highway crossing the river west of Harike village seems to have changed everything and we ended up in extensive gravel pits in the dried-up riverbed with little birding opportunities. Driving through Punjabi





farmland to/from Harike was a sad experience – intensive fields, active spaying of pesticides and accordingly few birds. While it is straightforward to see the waterfowl at Harike, we failed to find any of the two Indus-valley skulkers known from the area: Rufous-vented Grass Babbler *Laticilla burnesii* (formerly Rufous-vented Prinia *Prinia burnesii*) and the recently discovered Jerdon's Babbler *Chysomma altirostre*. Likewise, we failed to find Sind Sparrow (but saw it later at Sultanpur Jheel). More time and/or a guide for this area is probably the solution.

<u>Tansa Wildlife Sanctuary</u>. The main goal of visiting this area was the option of finding the recently rediscovered Forest Owlet. We had hired a guide in order to maximize the chance for finding the owl and to avoid the risk of unintentional disturbing the rare and threatened species. We heard the species on all three attempts to find it and saw it very well once. Tansa WS is only a couple of hours drive from Mumbai but quite extensive forest around large dam and I will recommend use of guide.

Corbett National Park. I visited Corbett National Park in 1986 on my first visit ever to India and again two years later in 1988. It was fantastic to return home in this fabulous area now 30+ years later. Corbett NP is a wonderful place with extensive forest, grassland, rivers and (artificial) lake. While the habitat was unchanged, then access was very different compared to the situation in the 80ties. Then I came with friends as backpackers. A public bus connected Dhikala with Ramnagar and cheap accommodation was either the dormitory or various simple huts (beside other accommodation of higher standard, which was out of reach for us poor students). Today there is no public busses and access to the core area is only allowed by prearranged jeep and largely restricted by the limited accommodation available in the now fenced Dhikala. Accommodation in Dhikala has been temporarily closed down, but is available again. The premises are

run-down but working – staff is exceptionally friendly and food is standard Indian vegetarian. In some ways, it reminded me of the backpacker days – though the price was notably different! Booking over the net is possible, while booking through agents in India seems a little tricky as options for reservations is put on the market shortly before the start of each month. Another significant change is that most visitors are Indian – of which many are dedicated photographers. There are two game-drives allowed per day – one morning and one afternoon. You must not leave the vehicle at any time hence today a number of well-situated observation posts are out of reach. These were fantastic in the 'old days'. Between game drives, one can enjoy the fabulous view from Dhikala over the floodplain, birdwatch the remaining scrub within the fenced area and check the sky for soaring birds. If not staying in Dhikala there are options for day-visits to eastern sectors of Corbett. There are numerous hotels/lodges along the road from Ramnagar.

While birding from vehicle is not ideal, it is perfect for mammaling – and for good security-reasons as Corbett today hold a significant elephant-population and the highest density of tigers in any Indian reserve (12-17 per 100 km²). More than 200 tigers live in Corbett in a stable if not increasing population. This healthy and viable tiger-population is vital for the survival of the species – besides Corbett holds the corepopulation for the Indian/Nepalese Terai.

Just outside Corbett there are a number of good birding localities with free access – though note that both elephants and tigers are passing by in the forested areas. Most well-known is the Kosi River around the spectacular Gariya Temple with good chances for Ibisbill in mid-winter. Scrubs along the river is excellent for birds. Unexpectedly, we recorded Pale Martin here



- seemingly attending nest holes (proof of breeding is to be confirmed). The dam on Kosi River by Ramnagar creates a permanent lake with many waterbirds. Good forest is found around Kumeria and Mohan. Your guide will know the details or you can find more information in various reports on the net, e.g. Grundsten & Sångberg (2018).

Pangoot is an excellent place to find a number of attractive species from western/central part of Himalaya, which can be difficult elsewhere: Cheer Pheasant, Koklass Pheasant, Upland Pipit and others. Find good description of access in e.g. Grundsten & Sångberg (2018). Note however, that the distance from Pangoot village (1950 m) to the steep slopes with chance for the exclusive species is around 4 km and at a higher altitude (2320 m) and a vehicle is advantageous. Weather was quite miserable during my stay with the second day being chilly, wet and with slow birding all day. All three mornings visits were made at the crucial slopes for the Cheer Pheasant. After two mornings entirely on our own it became a rather mixed and a little depressive experience on the third morning to find a foreign birder-group on the road by the three calling Koklass Pheasant down the slope. The morning was no longer quiet - play back at high volume made it difficult to enjoy the real call of the species and laser beams swept the scrub, when a Koklass Pheasant finally appeared. Shortly before this happened we were addressed with the phrase 'We are first on the mountain today – please stay behind' whereupon the two cars of the group were used to block the road. Not the attitude to expect from any foreign birders on any public road anywhere – not an attitude to expect among fellow birders - and extremely embarrassing for my dedicated and local guide, who for years have taken foreign birders to the place and made them happy. Commercial birding at its worst. The Koklass Pheasant retaliated as we at the rear saw it better than any in the group, who had to go backwards to see it.

<u>Sat Tal</u> is a forested area with lakes right east of the touristic Bhimtal. I had been booked at a town hotel overlooking the lake, but I will recommend finding accommodation closer by. The tarmac road winding down the Sat Tal area provides profitable birding – on the one side you look into the vegetation in the forest floor while on the other side your

views are at canopy level. The road ends at some local tourist facilities by a lake. Shortly before by a small Shiva Temple, a track leads through wet scrub along a stream, which is very good for wren babblers, Rufous-chinned Laughingthrush and other. Here the forest is under some kind of protection and a forester may charge you a small fee for entrance. It was raining during part of my time at Sat Tal and this restricted birding considerably.

<u>Tughlaqabad</u> holds extensive and magnificent ruins and also offers interesting birding. During my brief morning visit – partly hampered by a drizzle – I found e.g. Yellow-wattled Plovers (in the open area north of the fortress of Adilabad) and within the fort itself e.g. Sulphur-bellied Warbler and a Greater Coucal of the southern *parroti*-(sub-) species. If being in New Delhi with half a day free for birding, Tughlaqabad will be easy to combine with Ohkla Bird Sanctuary.

Ohkla Bird Sanctuary is an excellent area for wetland birds. It is quite a long walk from the entrance in the south to the reedbeds and scrub in the north.

Bhindawas Lake is a diked wetland in Haryana with high concentration of waterbirds – sometimes classified as 'old time Bharatpur'. Access is easy as there is a road on top of the dikes all the way round. Some observation platforms give general views of the area. My visit was on a windy and hazy day, which challenged the birding a little. 170 Ferruginous Ducks is a good number.

<u>Sultanpur Jheel</u> is a small national park situated just outside Gurgaon, SW of Delhi. When I visited Sultanpur Jheel first time in 1986 it was a reel jheel surrounded by open agricultural land. Since the lake has undergone dramatic change – and the city comes closer, the park is fenced and there is only water inside the park. While a natural jheel is shallow lake in a low-lying depression produced by rain and therefor highly dynamic because of variation in annual rainfall, then Sultanpur is today a permanent lake lined with Acacia-trees along the shores and on islets. Despite a large population of Nilgai and free-ranging cows, the Park seems more and more overgrown. Still, Sultanpur is a fantastic place for a birder – and the walk around the lake with all the birds at close range is unique. Besides the scrub is excellent for passerines. The population of Sind Sparrow is nice. A surprise find was two White-crowed Penduline Tits, which seems to be a new species for the reserve. Near the Park, one can find dryland mixed with fields and this is good for larks, pipits, wheatears and attractive icons like Indian Courser. Here I was shown another unusual species, a Variable Wheatear of the *opistholeuca*-form (which may be a full species).

Numbers have increased markedly over the years. E.g. the species is now widespread in Uttarakhand from Corbett NP up to Pangoot, which is in sharp contrast to the situation in 1986, when I visited part of the same areas and only saw one small flock (near Naini Tal). The single Rhesus Macaque seen at Ellora Caves appears to be a southerly record (photo 1).




- **4.** *Bonnet Macaque Macaca radiata. Maharashtra: 30/1 60+ Elephanta Island (photo 2).

Most individuals seen showed the backward-looped tail (southern Type II tail carridge) characteristic for this species, but in a group at Daulatabad some individuals had a forward-looped tail, others backward looped tails and some even mixed tail-carridge (see photos below). All langurs seen in Maharashtra showed variable pale grey to sooty grey hands and none had the distinct black hands characteristic for Northern Plains Langur. A genetic study (Ashalaksmi et al. 2014) shows a sample from Ellora, which is well within sp. hypoleucos, while Nag et al. (2011) found most individuals from Ellora had the northern type tail carriage. The visited sites (Ajanta, Daulatabad and Ellora) seems to be in or near a zone, where the two species hybridize.

The Terai and Nepal Grey Langur share a number of characters separating them from Northern Plains Langur: Distinct white ruff, grey hands and indication of moustachial stripe. In between, they are very similar and e.g. their size difference is not an easy character in the field. To my eye, the most obvious difference is the overall fur-color with Terai Grey Langur being pale grey, while the Nepal Grey Langur is darker grey on the back – see photos (photos 6-8 of Terai Grey Langur, photo 9 of Nepal Grey Langur).

Cheer Pheasant Catreus wallichii. Uttarakhand: 13-15/2 none found Vinayak. - Three morning visits to the slopes with changes for Cheer Pheasant were without success. On 13/2 two groups of women from villages lower down was cutting grass for their domestic animals on parts of the slopes (photo 17). Free-ranging dogs followed the women and this could perhaps partly explain the lack of Cheer Pheasants and Gorals. On 14/2 weather was miserable with slopes enveloped in clouds, when we arrived (photo 19). It cleared up for a while – but later shifting showers took over – rain, thunder and hail – and the day ended with heavy rain and thunder during the night. The sky was clear on the 15/2 but the foregoing wet weather may have pushed the pheasants to lower altitudes (Sunil Kumar pers.com.).

Rasmussen & Anderton (2005) suggests ssp. parroti may be a full species. Photo 20 shows an adult bird from Tansa WS, which is well within the distribution of this (sub) species. The other two photos (21 & 22) shows the same bird seen at Tughlaqabad (New Delhi), i.e. close to/within the known range of (sub) species sinensis. This bird shows the dull brownish forehead, face and throat mentioned as an important character for ssp. parroti. I think the bird is a juvenile/immature because of the dusky plumage included the chestnut wings. If I am right, the uniform black tail is another vital character as juvenile sinensis has strongly barred tails (and variable barring on underparts).





Two photos of this gull (photo 40 & 41). In the field, I assessed the bird a little smaller than the Heuglin's Gull seen. The paler back and yellow legs is fine for Taimyr Gull, but particularly the densely streaked head and the perhaps a little shorter legs is better for Vega Gull. Indeed, Taimyr Gull is considered a hybrid between Heuglin's Gull and north-eastern Palearctic Vega Gull (Olsen & Larsson 2003, Olsen 2018) and this gulls is probably best described as a mix between the two with a significant input from Vega Gull. Ganpule (2016) reports probable ssp. taimyrensis from Gujarat and it is discussed that some of his birds shows possible mix with Vega Gull.




