Cesar Zevallos Bashualdo Whatsapp +51955835819 Cesar was very quick to respond to Whatsapp messages and was very professional. He met us in Ondores on the road and guided us in to his house here https://goo.gl/maps/JhyUsE1ZpeAbF7Cd8 which was painted white, blue and red. He gave us a great birding tour but importantly got us great views of **Junin Rail** and **Junin Grebe** from a 3hour boat trip. Contact him for costs.

One of the best days of the trip for me.

TRIP IN GENERAL

Yet again, another trip planned at the last minute, but Peru is an easy country for that as it's cheap, has Hospedajes, Hotels and Hostels just about everywhere and there is plenty of sites/ information out there on the Internet/ ebird so a lot of the planning was be done as we travelled. The excellent Field Guide by Schulenberg et al and the Merlin app had all the info we needed for identification, current taxonomy and calls/songs (although I had to spend a day updating my field guide but the app was good).

The only thing we booked apart from the first 2 car rentals was a day out with Cesar at Lake Junin.

I went out 8 days before the other 3 arrived and had another week after they all left. This allowed me to charge around up in the Tumbes and Maranon scooping up some of the areas specialities and endemics.

The Road Police were a pain again this time and I got nicked for driving without my headlights on in the daytime (forgot as frequently getting in and out of the car birding), and I also ran some red lights (by half a second and 2 Cops happened to be there, left the car that came through after me and threatened me with a big fine.. So just 50 Soles to waive the no lights ticket and 100 Soles for the red light... bunch of assholes. I did argue with another one as I put my lights on as I came out of a petrol station and he was trying it on ... I'd had enough of them by then and he just walked away when he could see I wasn't going to pay him.

REMEMBER LIGHTS ON ALL THE TIME !!

The roads in the Andes were particularly bad and the main problem in the dry summer was the huge amounts of dust coating everything with clouds of dirt. All Peruvians drive like Kamikaze pilots at speeds that lift the maximum dust clouds and honk their horns continually as some form of communication... a form of aggressive language. This also makes birding unpleasant on dirt roads as only one car was needed to coat you and your optics in a layer of dust, so we tried to find places far enough away from the road to dodge the dust.

The route we took would be exceptionally challenging if not impossible in the rainy season as we could see the numerous landslides from the previous winter's rain, sprawled out across the dirt roads in many places.

We spent a lot of time driving between sites as the roads were often shit and although the distances were not too great, the road conditions usually dictated speeds of around only 30-40km/hr.

The accommodation was usually very basic but clean, sometimes with hot (ish) water but mostly very cheap and often with a cochera to keep the car off the road and safe in a locked compound.

The best places for me were high up in the Andes where the people were more chilled and the food better and the birds less covered in dust.

Most sites delivered the required species but disappointing dips included Cloud-Forest Screech Owl and Rufous-breasted Warbling Finch. White-winged, Large-footed and Neblina Tapaculos were all heard at Bosque Unchog, but would just not respond (although the other 3 saw Neblina Tapaculo) and also the continuing saga of the phantom, near-mythical Raimondi's Yellow Finch which eluded us at 3 different sites.

Amongst the many great birds and days, stand out experiences for me were Lake Junin with Cesar, birding along the road at Calabaza, wandering around Parque Huascaran and the Undulated Antpitta that appeared up close and personal at Bosque Unchog, and the last days birding where Maranon Crescentchest, Cajamarca Antpitta, Jelski's Chat-Tyrant and Short-tailed Woodstar all performed quickly.

But apart from the long, dusty drives, miles of cavernous potholes, dangerous drivers, rotten Police, barking dogs through the night, cold showers, shit and rubbish everywhere, constant honking of horns and something that made me and Graham puke like dogs... we had a great trip!

ITINERARY

June 11th Dropped off at the bus station by Helen again and on time to LHR T3. Easy, hassle-free checkin and bag drop at the Virgin Atlantic area and away to JFK on time. Landed early at JFK and had a 7 hour wait in the expensive airport before departing for Lima just after midnight.

- Landed at Lima early and soon out to meet the Car Rental agent. Got 1400 Sol out of the BCP bank at the airport and was then surprised to be given a Toyota Rush which was a great high clearance upgrade from the cheapest car I booked.

 Drove straight to the Lomas De Lachay access Rd for a few hours and then tried the road to the east failing to find any Raimondi's Yellow Finches. Drove north on to the next spot at Bosque Lampay https://goo.gl/maps/T8BdrV7RX9xnvsJDA before making a dash further on to Gramadal https://goo.gl/maps/XTCxZf4MniqrQP8u6 to get great views of Peruvian Plantcutters despite the strong winds there. Just had enough time to flash up to Tuquillo Beach https://goo.gl/maps/yP4cwdZj87Q5hrQi7 for Surf Cinclodes before calling it a night and driving back to stay at the Hotel Miramar in Huarmey https://goo.gl/maps/LuWS54SuAh7Yyy11A
- Up at dawn and started driving north. Stopped off at Chao https://goo.gl/maps/Lhvqv8bE4G8WXcA46 for c3 hrs as the birding was great. With time rolling on I set off north again taking in a stop north of Trujillo for Cinereous Finch and then made a dash for Chiclayo unfortunately forgetting to turn my headlights back on and so got stopped by the Police who kindly accepted a 50 Soles bribe (his idea not mine) to waive the ticket. Late into Chiclayo at c7.30pm and found a hotel fairly quickly. Still Knackered!
- 14th Up at 5am and tried the BCP atms, none of which worked so had to try a BBVA which only allowed 400 S max and charged 38 Soles for it Drove north along the mainly shit and slow road to Olmos and then tried the dirt track to Limon which was very poor. Tried another route in which was still bad but not as sandy and **finally got to Limon by 3.30pm**. Asked a kid if I could park by their house and walked the **Quebrada Frejolillo (or Limon) till dusk**. (track starts here https://goo.gl/maps/LALSXY4YPs1iBDLx6) Came back at dusk and asked if ok to sleep in the car which it was.





15th Not too bad a nights kip so up at 4.50am and started walking back up to the track to the Quebrada in the dark doing a spot of owling on route. Walked slowly up the Quebrada from here https://goo.gl/maps/eMMpQQyUJ4RAv4jeA having a great mornings birding. Left Limon about 11am and slowly birded my way back eventually staying in Olmos at the Hotel Monterrico https://goo.gl/maps/3SQ2dtcYMEuBViAn9 for 60 Soles. room and Hotel swarming with crickets!

16th Up before dawn and away crunching the swarming insects on the Hotel floors. Stopped at a few roadside places but not much good so drove to Zapotal https://goo.gl/maps/tP3H4Vn5PWEzxkkv9 and had a few hours again with very little to show for a lot of leg work. Drove on to Bosque De Pomac but it was closed due to excess river damage to the road. Tried the eastern entrance but still closed so had a walk around the visitor Centre there instead. Drove just south of Chiclayo to stay at the Hostal El Eden in the best room yet for 75 S and had a great meal just across the road. https://goo.gl/maps/otcBFAR56EZFiC6y8

Up and away before dawn getting to this area https://goo.gl/maps/qbeTBuYteBTDJjHa7 for a few hours from dawn, then onto to Bosque El Canoncillo https://goo.gl/maps/kgoT7pgNoxijP5AK6 for 3 hours before making the long drive back down to the Hotel Miramar in Huarmey arriving at 10.30pm after being stung by the wonderful Peruvian Police for 100 Soles for a "red light" offence.... What a bunch of arseholes the Peruvian Police are.

No petrol at Huarmey!! Tense drive to Barranca on 2 bars of a fuel tank but made it! phew! Car wash next as it was ditched and scratched to buggery, but a 20 Soles wash brought it up good as new. Drove on to **Lomas De Lachay** which failed to deliver Raimondi's Yellow Finch yet again so drove south to another area staying at the Beirut-bombed-out style area at another Hotel El Eden https://goo.gl/maps/zMoWomizgu29ZHv66 which was fine although no food within easy walking distance.

19th MET GRAHAM, RICH AND DAN. Car hire problems..(see above in Car Rental section) Drove towards the next site staying here at Chosica https://goo.gl/maps/fRPMXnUw5wbxqy2B7 where we had 2 twin rooms for £22 and the owner gave us 4 free beers in the morning when we left!

20th Up and away c6am driving steadily to the Autisha Bridge https://goo.gl/maps/TCsgYZvHszt8LK2y6 and then on to San Pedro De Castra where we checked in to the cheap Hotel Municipal https://goo.gl/maps/TCsgYZvHszt8LK2y6 on the Plaza and then had something to eat next door before driving a few km beyond the town to spend the rest of the day till dark along the road before heading back.

21st All day San Pedro De Castra area Rufous-breasted Warbling Finch in vain.



Steadily drove on at 6am to white cheeked Cotinga site at **Quebrada Yanac** https://goo.gl/maps/79f3QUStTorzDzbt5 and then the long drive to Pampa Curicocha https://goo.gl/maps/vA5ASGmHFiyheQJg6 for White-bellied Cinclodes. Then on to stay at **Nebys hotel Junin** https://goo.gl/maps/dRQ56jsCTWbyAtWMA which Cesar had booked for us in as we were arriving late.



Away by 5.30am doing the 30 minute drive to meet Cesar on the road outside his house at 6am... with a flat tyre. Quickly replaced it with the spare, had a quick breakfast with Cesar and then we all went in our car to the Junin Rail spot. After c 30mins we drove north to get into Cesars' boat where we had a great 3 hr trip out onto the calm Lake Junin. Cesar then took us to several sites for some other targets before we said our goodbyes and drove on to Conception (via a tyre repair in Junin) to stay at the Hotel Paraiso for 3 nights https://goo.gl/maps/YB2Hjqi8mBwovePi8. Out to the nearby plaza for some Western food and beers to celebrate a memorable day.







Away at 6am for the short drive to this area https://goo.gl/maps/fFoTBStYW5oFnSKg6 (along this track somewhere) to target Western Bearded Mountaineer and Andean Parakeet. Back early via a car wash 15 soles to organise the next leg of the trip.



Away at 5am to drive to the Pariahuanca Rd but got stopped 14km from our target site due to a road slide/ repair. Birded here https://goo.gl/maps/DnaKpNbDP6ZGLnXm6 till midday when the road opened. Birded these areas https://goo.gl/maps/we35st4g7jvtFE2Q7 and as far as about here https://goo.gl/maps/t8u8d7qU4RfWt9hB7 before heading back along the poor and dusty road arriving back at the Hotel for 7.30pm



26th Away at 6am driving the main route to Satipo. Stopped at a few places along the dusty road to this area for Eye-ringed Thistletail the

Stopped at a few places along the dusty road to this area for Eye-ringed Thistletail then on to bird another area before finally getting some accommodation at Calabaza https://goo.gl/maps/LjHkLwJaFiNXGo7x7 for 20 S each. The owner of the Hostal owned the restaurant too. Birded the Andamarca Rd south from Calabaza till dusk then a meal at the Hotel owners' restaurant.

Up at 4.30am doing notes as had a good kip. Away at 6.30 after a good cooked breakfast **slowly birding west from Calabaza back to the river bridge c 14km west**. A fantastic day as we drove slowly and just stopped as and when we saw bird flocks. 12 new birds including 3 antpittas.





Road to the Andamarca Valley all day. First few km from Calabaza for the morning till c 10am then drove a further 2 hours to look for the Mantaro birds. Stayed till dark for Koepcke's Screech Owl https://goo.gl/maps/T4m2jwXokjh67N4MA here then made a fast return for 9pm to Calabaza.

30th **Drove on north to Villa Rica** and then straight up to **Bosque Shollet** for a few hours birding till 1pm when we decided to find a hotel and eat in readiness for some owling later.100m from the Bosque Shollet turn off from Villa Rica we found the **Hotel El Sol** https://goo.gl/maps/PLa3Bs9qEFy4k7br5, 80 Sol /twin room and lots of restaurants. Dumped the bags in the Hotel and had a kip returning to Bosque Shollet at 4pm to 8.30pm where the busy road and full moon didn't help with looking or listening for owls.

1st July Away from the hotel late as blocked in at 4.30 arriving for owling at Bosque Shollet by 5am with no moon. .. still no owls. Birded there till midday and then went back to Villa Rica for food, rest and a cleanup. Out again at 4pm birding the coffee plantations along the lower part of the road for Creamy-bellied Antwren and then doubled back to try Lake Onconal on the southern outskirts of Villa Rica. Stayed till dark for Band-bellied Owl at Restaurant Vista Hermosa https://goo.gl/maps/aYNqjyyKFcZVSLcy6





2nd Up and away back-tracking a little to unsuccessfully find a site for Black-billed seed finch early on before continuing on to Hacienda Amorique https://goo.gl/maps/Efnnuro1qiuN9uSd9 where we soon found Martin and Nancy. A superb little Hacienda in the forest. 50 S each for a bed, 55 soles each for 3 meals a day and a one off fee of 50 soles each entrance fee. We hung around the Hacienda seeing a few good birds before being taken up the hill at 4pm for some birding and owling till 9pm.

- **3rd** Up early for breakfast and got taken up the hill with 2 American photographers where we were left to bird our way down arriving back at the Hacienda at 3.30pm. Wash and dinner before another owling session till 9.30pm.
- **4**th Same again today as yesterday.
- 5th Birded below **Hacienda Amorique till 11 am** then drove 6hrs to stay at a town just 30km south of the Rufous backed Inca Finch site. Cheap hotel and food.
- 6th Away in the dark 10km to Salcachupan https://goo.gl/maps/wAeMU8magMVKcxQL9 by dawn but lots of fast traffic in a very dusty road so we drove on to the next Inca finch site here which proved an easy location https://goo.gl/maps/5ZGEvKXkvtKNCr9JA

We then carried on to **Santa Maria Del Valle** to stay at the **Hospedaje Valle De Cony** https://goo.gl/maps/5ZGEvKXkvtKNCr9JA 5km west of the turn off https://goo.gl/maps/S67ob6MD3GzvSPpZ9 . Drove the dusty track up there to arrive at 2.30pm. birded till after dark and then drove back. Took about 1.5 hrs up and 1hr 10 down.



7th All day Bosque Unchog.

8th Carpish tunnel road https://goo.gl/maps/M2GnNafKr3TE7Qx49 am then back up Unchog birding just north of Cochabamba and a little at unchog in the fog.

9th Bosque Unchog all day.



All day up at **Bosque Montepotrero** the Panao Antpitta site. Turned off here https://goo.gl/maps/bzSjNWN6YBDFe9Ye8 and parked here https://goo.gl/maps/SovAcYqd2zfZ6m3u7 and walked to the entrance gate here https://goo.gl/maps/SovAcYqd2zfZ6m3u7 and walked to the entrance gate here https://goo.gl/maps/SovAcYqd2zfZ6m3u7 but no one about so ducked under the fence to walk the trail. Feeling crap and had several field toilet visits and eventually had to leave the others and trudge slowly back to the car to rest. 30% better after throwing up so didn't eat out tonight and caught up a bit. Saw the target Panao Antpitta easily while the others had great views of Undulated Antpitta after I trudged back throwing up. Still no one around when I walked back.



All day driving to Yungay on an absolute shit dirt road nearly all the way arriving at the Sagado Hotel https://goo.gl/maps/pRMYmbUcN1Qp5HF99 at 7pm. 90 soles twin room.! Yungay ok though with lots of shops and restaurants nearby.



All day Parque Huascaran going no further than here https://goo.gl/maps/rLgaN2tdPHggkQmw7. Also at the restauarante here https://goo.gl/maps/RCuS5iivZjTDshhS9 in the afternoon and till dark when we easily saw Koepcke's Screech Owl.





Am at Pale-tailed Canastero site here https://goo.gl/maps/J8iLc31LJZk4m74L9 then drove on via a car wash to stay at Cajacay in the Hotel Cesar https://goo.gl/maps/GEGyatjcWh9vFXpB9 taking a nice dog for dinner......

Early drive on to bird Valle Marca https://goo.gl/maps/B2dSZ9m9kjzJ6NEy7 till c11am before driving to Huacho via Gramadal. Stayed at the Hotel Mar De Costa https://goo.gl/maps/ARAbUXbL6Lm1XeVU9

16th Early off to Lomas De Lachay and the canyon to the southeast before going back to the hotel and scanning from the balcony. The others went for a beach stroll while I planned my last week and organised car rental. Good birding from the Hotel balcony!

Up and away at 6am to Paraiso wetlands and coast https://goo.gl/maps/6xz3scJuPnbbQPw98 for a few hours before the tortuous drive through Lima to here https://goo.gl/maps/6xz3scJuPnbbQPw98 where we were then only 28km north of Lomas de Asia. Went out there for the last hour of light doing a recce and waiting till dark for Tschudi's Nightjars here https://goo.gl/maps/ywrmbRqWL3wkN5VGA .

18th **Lomas De Asia** https://goo.gl/maps/oNYozbegad6G44vo9 all day from 8am opening to 3pm knackered closes 5pm. 10 Soles pp and again, no Raimondi's Yellow Finch.

19th Driving day. Drove from here to the airport to drop off Dan for his flight home and Rich and Gray at their hotel. Managed to collect the car early and set off north arriving at **Trujillo about 10pm**. Hostal for 30 S and out like a light.





20th Up and leaving at 6am driving east to arrive at El Molino https://goo.gl/maps/hjJaN4bxLja3dzyJ8 for 2,30pm. Found the 2 birds straight away and then a warden who took me to a few flowering sites including his garden which was good for photos. Left at 4pm to tackle the shit road back to Chugay arriving at dark and booking in to the Hostal for 30 Soles.

Awake at 5.45 after a great sleep through the alarm for 5.30am. Driving day again to San Marcos for a few hours but no birds as in the heat of the day so drove to Jesus by 3pm for an hours birding here https://goo.gl/maps/rco1Qcb4XkvkpkUx7 before driving on to the Grey belied Comet area. Found a great Hospedaje by the runway https://goo.gl/maps/PiwGmh6QrVtAETcaA for 50 Soles where got cleaned up and rested.

Awake at 6am and drove to here https://goo.gl/maps/H1PkYmxZmVw32vkr8 for Grey-bellied Comet left at 9.30 driving to Celendin and booked into a roadside Hospedaje https://goo.gl/maps/fayqPM3PMAXvk4aq5 for 30 Soles. After some food I then birded the area to the north of the town to Llanguat to about here https://goo.gl/maps/6qoFELt3XeHeivrk9. However the wind was up making birding difficult so I returned and birded back along the road till dusk. Llanguat


- **All day along the road to Balsas** https://goo.gl/maps/RMWFpmWD9PS4nHva7 and back. Tough birding with few singing birds and hot very early on. However with a bit of perseverance most were seen well.
- 24th Started at dawn along the rd to Llanguat for Maranon Crescentchest here https://goo.gl/maps/wPBxoYJp3ATBuffX6 till 8am then drove west trying a few roadside areas for Cajamarca Antpitta and Jelski's Chat Tyrant having no luck until finally connecting with both birds here https://goo.gl/maps/NbTvE4hiaz2CcsWa8 before the long drive west stopping for a while before dusk here for Short-tailed Woodstar here https://goo.gl/maps/K8MQYWHUNQKBqax78. Decided to carry on towards Lima finally giving up at Chimbote at midnight.
- 25th Left at 7am back to Lima. Dropped off the car and walked back to the Paypurix Hostal for a well-earned rest. Trip over!
 26th Day getting sorted and cleaned up ready for home.
- 27th Taxi from Paypurix Hostal to the airport at 5am and 15 Soles. Flight home at 8.10 am.

SYSTEMATIC LIST (IOC WILDLIFE RECORDER 4 & IOC 13.2) ENDEMIC = PERUVIAN ENDEMIC

- 1. Brown Tinamou (Crypturellus obsoletus) Heard at Hacienda Amorique.
- 2. **PALE-BROWED TINAMOU** (Crypturellus transfasciatus) 1, Jun 15th at Quebrada Frejolillo, Limon and commonly heard there. Frustratingly difficult to see even though close but I eventually managed to tempt a calling bird out into view close up at the edge of the farmland when leaving the Quebrada. A strikingly marked bird with pale grey shawl and neck, brown and black barred back and wings, contrasting pale supercillium, long, slightly decurved bill and red legs and feet.
- 3. Tataupa Tinamou (Crypturellus tataupa) 1 seen at the lower part of the track at Hacienda Amorique.



4. **Ornate Tinamou** (Nothoprocta ornata) 5 Ads and 2 medium-sized young at Lake Junin.





- 5. **Andean Tinamou** (Nothoprocta pentlandii) 7 birds seen in all from San Pedro de Castra along the various high altitude roads along the west slope to Cajamarca. Photo above left is along the road from Bosque Unchog to Yungay.
- 6. **CURVE-BILLED TINAMOU** (Nothoprocta curvirostris) 1, Jul 10th Montepotrero in the recently ploughed field between the end car park and the reserve entrance/ office (photo above right).
- 7. Torrent Duck (Merganetta armata) A few noted.
- 8. Andean Goose (Chloephaga melanoptera) Often noted in the highest parts of the Andes, usually in pairs or groups up to 40.
- 9. Crested Duck (Lophonetta specularioides) A few small groups or pairs on lakes at high altitudes.
- 10. **Puna Teal** (Spatula puna) Several noted 12th-14th Jul in PN Huascaran.
- 11. Cinnamon Teal (Spatula cyanoptera) A few at El Paraiso wetlands just sth of Huacho.
- 12. White-cheeked Pintail (Anas bahamensis) Common at at El Paraiso wetlands just sth of Huacho.
- 13. Yellow-billed Pintail (South American) (Anas georgica spinicauda/niceforoi) A few noted.
- 14. Yellow-billed Teal (oxyptera) (Anas flavirostris oxyptera) A few noted.
- 15. Andean Duck (Oxyura ferruginea ferruginea) Several at Junin, the lakes along the road to Calabaza and at PN Huascaran.
- 16. Speckled Chachalaca (Speckled) (Ortalis guttata guttata/subaffinis) 3, Calabaza rd, and common at Hacienda Amorique.
- 17. Andean Guan (Penelope montagnii) 4 birds noted in all.







18. WHITE-WINGED GUAN (Penelope albipennis) 4 birds seen and another 2 heard only, Jun 15th Quebrada Frejolillo, Limon. No sign the evening before. Just the one bird found sitting quietly at the top of the Quebrada where the trail crosses the bend in the river.

- 19. Lesser Nighthawk (Chordeiles acutipennis) A few birds seen in the evening up in the Tumbes and down around Lomas de Asia.
- 20. Pauraque (Nyctidromus albicollis) Heard only at Lake Onconal.
- 21. ANTHONY'S NIGHTJAR (Nyctidromus anthonyi) Single birds on 14th-15th Jun and at least 8 heard in the morning of the 15th around Limon on the walk to the Quebrada. The first bird on 14th was just around the houses at Limon at the road junction at dusk
- 22. Tschudi's Nightjar (Systellura decussata) 2 at Lomas de Asia at dusk were seen close several times perched and in flight.



23. Lyre-tailed Nightjar (Uropsalis lyra) A female, Jun 27th Calabaza village opposite the restaurant.



- 24. Ocellated Poorwill (Nyctiphrynus ocellatus) 2 birds seen and another 8 calling at Hacienda Amorique.
- 25. **Chestnut-collared Swift** (Streptoprocne rutila) A few seen on 1st, 5th and also 8th Jul (photos) at Cochabamba flying up and down at eye level.







- 26. White-collared Swift (Streptoprocne zonaris) A big flock along the road on Jul 5th.
- 27. Andean Swift (Aeronautes andecolus) Several small groups up in the Andes.
- 28. WHITE-BROWED HERMIT (Phaethornis stuarti) 2-3 birds, Jul 4th and 1 on 5th, Hacienda Amorique.
- 29. Green Hermit (Phaethornis guy) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.





- 30. Geoffroy's Daggerbill (Schistes geoffroyi) 2 birds with 1 photod at Hacienda Amorique above left.
- 31. Lesser Violetear (Andean) (Colibri cyanotus [cyanotus-group]) Several at Hacienda Amorique.
- 32. Sparkling Violetear (Colibri coruscans) Common at altitude calling and scrapping incessantly above right.
- 33. Amethyst-throated Sunangel (Heliangelus amethysticollis) 1+ Carpish Tunnel.
- 34. Speckled Hummingbird (Speckled) (Adelomyia melanogenys [melanogenys-group]) A few noted.
- 35. Long-tailed Sylph (Aglaiocercus kingii) c6 Calabaza Rd and 1 on Jun 20th.





36. **BRONZE-TAILED COMET** (Polyonymus caroli) 2+, Jun 20th, 4 on 21st San Pedro de Castra (photos above. Also a male sth of Huancayo and 5 at Valle Marca.







37. **GREY-BELLIED COMET** (Taphrolesbia griseiventris) 1, Jul 22nd NE of Otuzco feeding along the river there at c 9am. A striking and large Hummer with a distinctive bounding flight which was not done justice in the field guide! Well worth the effort in the freezing dawn cold. Took a few hours to find but the the large pink flowers near the river was a hint of where to wait.

38. **GREEN-HEADED HILLSTAR** (Oreotrochilus stolzmanni) A pair, Jul 15th at PN Huascaran.

Both were hanging around the same large cluster of red leaved epiphytes and were feeding from the very newest yellowy-orange emerging flowers.

Brownish breast stripe seen well on the male who was More active than the female.





- 39. **BLACK-BREASTED HILLSTAR** (Oreotrochilus melanogaster) A male and a female, Jun 23rd Lake Junin. The male above was just plain spectacular.
- 40. **Green-tailed Trainbearer** (Lesbia nuna) 6 sth of Huancayo and several around Calabaza.
- 41. **BEARDED MOUNTAINEER** (**WESTERN**) (Oreonympha nobilis albolimbata) Male, Jun 24th just sth of Huancayo was spectacular as it fed on the yellow Nicotina flowers but was far too quick to get the camera on it.
- 42. OLIVACEOUS THORNBILL (Chalcostigma olivaceum) 1, Jun 22nd on the drive to Junin from Pampa Curricocha feeding on the flowering cushionplants almost bouncing from one ground plant to another.
- 43. **Tyrian Metaltail (Cajamarca)** (Metallura tyrianthina septentrionalis) Females on 22nd and 24th Jul near Cajamarca.



44. **COPPERY METALTAIL** (Metallura theresiae) Commonly seen at Bosque Unchog 6th to 11th Jul. Very territorial and a few nests found under overhanging vegetation, one of which had 2 eggs in it.



- 45. FIERY-THROATED METALTAIL (Metallura eupogon) 6+, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd and 1 in the Calabaza rd.
- 46. **BLACK METALTAIL** (Metallura phoebe) 2, Jun 22nd on the roadside just before Quebrada Yanac.
- 47. **Sapphire-vented Puffleg** (Coppery-naped) (Eriocnemis luciani sapphiropygia/catharina) Sev Jul 10th Bosque Montepotrero.
- 48. **Emerald-bellied Puffleg** (Eriocnemis aline) 2, Hacienda Amorique.



49. **Shining Sunbeam** (Aglaeactis cupripennis) c 12 birds noted in all with a bird showing a few white breast spots (photo) at Bosque Montepotrero.







- 50. **PURPLE-BACKED SUNBEAM** (Aglaeactis aliciae) 3-5, Jul 20th Molino at the Purple-backed Sunbeam Reserve. Found almost immediately but then the reserve warden showed up and invited me to his house where the birds were nesting. Superb views.
- 51. Collared Inca (Collared) (Coeligena torquata [torquata-group]) Several in the Calabaza area.
- 52. **VIOLET-THROATED STARFRONTLET** (**HUANUCO**) (Coeligena violifer dichroura) 3, Jun 27th Calabaza area.
- 53. Rainbow Starfrontlet (Coeligena iris) singles at El Molino and towards Balsas.
- 54. **Mountain Velvetbreast** (Lafresnaya lafresnayi) Singles at the Pariahuanca Rd and Bosque Montepotrero.
- 55. Sword-billed Hummingbird (Ensifera ensifera) 1 on Jun 27^{th} Calabaza.
- 56. **Chestnut-breasted Coronet** (Boissonneaua matthewsii) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.
- 57. RUFOUS-BOOTED RACKET-TAIL (ANNA'S) (Ocreatus addae annae) male, Jul 3rd and a female 4th Hacienda Amorique.



- 58. **Giant Hummingbird** (Patagona gigas) Fairly common at the higher altitudes.
- 59. **Purple-collared Woodstar** (Myrtis fanny) 4+, including some spectacular males at San Pedro de Castra, a few at Valle Marca and a few on the Balsas rd.





- 60. **Oasis Hummingbird** (Rhodopis vesper) 5 birds, including the male above, San Pedro de Castra. Also a few at the Pale-tailed Canastero site and Valle Marca as well as along the Balsas Rd.
- 61. **SHORT-TAILED WOODSTAR** (Myrmia micrura) 1-2 birds, Jul 24th west end of Gallito Ciego up a dry river 100m from the road. The insect-like waif flew in within a few seconds of playing Peruvian pygmy owl and buzzed about landing a few times before charging off up a hillside but returning again 30 mins later to repeat the views.
- 62. **Peruvian Sheartail** (Thaumastura cora)
 Common at San Pedro de Castra (photo right) and
 Also Valle Marca.
- 63. **Fork-tailed Woodnymph** (Thalurania furcata) Common at Hacienda Amorique.





64. **SPOT-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD** (Thaumasius taczanowskii) 5, Jul 14th at Rinconada (Pale-tailed Canastero site) above right and also a few along the road to Balsas.



- 65. Amazilia Hummingbird (Green-throated) (Amazilis amazilia amazilia) Common along the west coast. Above left.
- 66. Andean Emerald (Uranomitra franciae) 4 birds noted around Balsas. Above right.
- 67. **Sapphire-spangled Emerald (Spot-vented)** (Chionomesa lactea bartletti) 2-3 at Hacienda Amorique.
- 68. **White-bellied Hummingbird** (chionogaster) (Elliotomyia chionogaster chionogaster) A few birds at Calabaza and Hacienda Amorique.
- 69. **Groove-billed Ani** (Crotophaga sulcirostris) Only Groovers noted commonly along the west slope lowlands.
- 70. Squirrel Cuckoo (Amazonian) (Piaya cayana [cayana-group]) A few at Hacienda Amorique.
- 71. Dark-billed Cuckoo (Coccyzus melacoryphus) 1 at Chao.
- 72. **Spot-winged Pigeon** (albipennis) (Patagioenas maculosa albipennis) Several sth of Huanaco and along the Pariahuanca Rd.



- 73. MARANON PIGEON (Patagioenas oenops) c50 birds Jul 22nd in a loose group at Llanguat feeding in the large trees along the road just before it turns left and follows the river at the bottom of the valley. Aka Peruvian Pigeon.
- 74. **Croaking Ground Dove** (Columbina cruziana) Common.



- 75. Bare-faced Ground Dove (Metriopelia ceciliae) Several at San Pedro de Castra (left) and Balsas (right).
- 76. Black-winged Ground Dove (Metriopelia melanoptera) Several around San Pedro de Castra.
- 77. White-tipped Dove (Leptotila verreauxi) Several identified at Hacienda Amorique and Balsas.
- 78. Eared Dove (Zenaida auriculata) Common.
- 79. West Peruvian Dove (Zenaida meloda) Abundant.
- 80. **Plumbeous Rail** (Pardirallus sanguinolentus) 1 bird crossing the mud at Laguna Contaycocha.

81. **Common Gallinule (American)** (Gallinula galeata [galeata-group] Common at El Paraiso, Huacho. (**Altiplano**) (Gallinula galeata garmani) Common at Lake Junin.



- 82. **Giant Coot** (Fulica gigantea) A few on the altiplano lakes driving east to Junin and 4 at Junin and also seen at Laguna Contaycocha and Laguna Conacocha.
- 83. Andean Coot (Fulica ardesiaca) Common at Junin.
- 84. Purple Gallinule (Porphyrio martinica) Noted at Lake Onconal.



- 85. **BLACK RAIL** (**JUNIN**) (Laterallus jamaicensis tuerosi) 2, Jun 23rd Lake Junin. Watched at close range in the morning in an area of open reeds. Fantastic close views with the help of **Cesar Zevallos Bashualdo** (see page 2). The birds were a little vocal but came in for the small amount of corn placed in the reeds. Superb experience and one of the trip highlights.
- 86. Limpkin (Brown-backed) (Aramus guarauna guarauna) 1 Lake Onconal.
- 87. Pied-billed Grebe (Podilymbus podiceps) 1, El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 88. Great Grebe (Podiceps major) a few off the beach at Huacho.



89. Silvery Grebe (Andean) (Podiceps occipitalis juninensis) common over 4000m on the way to and at Lake Junin.



90. **JUNIN GREBE** (Podiceps taczanowskii) c6 birds, Jun 23rd Lake Junin from the boat trip with Cesar. The first few views were very obviously Junin Grebes but later in the day when the birds were more relaxed their head profiles became more domed like Silvery Grebes and they could be more tricky to id as they didn't hang about on the surface much. A bird thought to be a Junin juvenile (accompanied by a pair of Junins) could be very difficult at range. I picked the most obvious photos that show the long neck, rear peaking crown and grey bill. A feature that may also be useful was that most birds often seemed to have their rear end submerged, something not noted on the Silvery Grebes.

91. Chilean Flamingo (Phoenicopterus chilensis) 300+ Lake Junin and also noted in smaller numbers on high altitude lakes.







- 92. **PERUVIAN THICK-KNEE** (Burhinus superciliaris) 4, Jun 12th and 6 July 16th and 5 on 17th Lomas de Lachay half way along the entrance road. Also c 30 birds along the entrance track to Communal Park Aucallama (which wasn't accessable) and another 2 birds at Lomas de Asia.
- 93. Blackish Oystercatcher (Haematopus ater) 6 birds at Huacho and El Paraiso nearby.
- 94. **American Oystercatcher** (Haematopus palliatus) Common at Huacho and El Paraiso.



- 95. Black-necked Stilt (Himantopus mexicanus) Regularly noted in lowland wet habitat.
- 96. Andean Avocet (Recurvirostra andina) A few at Lake Junin.



- 97. Andean Lapwing (Vanellus resplendens) Fairly common over 3600m. Photod at Bosque Unchog.
- 98. **Grey Plover** (Pluvialis squatarola) 1, El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 99. Killdeer (Charadrius vociferus) A few at El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 100. Snowy Plover (Humboldt) (Charadrius nivosus occidentalis) A few at El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 101. **Diademed Sandpiper-plover** (Phegornis mitchellii) Single birds, Jun 22nd at Pampa Curicocha and Paso Marcopomacocha.





- 102. **Grey-breasted Seedsnipe** (Thinocorus orbignyianus) 4, Jun 22nd at c5000m west of Pampa Curicocha. Photo above left.
- 103. Least Seedsnipe (Thinocorus rumicivorus) 15 in all at Lomas de Lachay on 4 visits. Photo above right.
- 104. Hudsonian Whimbrel (Numenius hudsonicus) Several at El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 105. Sanderling (Calidris alba) Several at El Paraiso, Huacho.



- 106. PUNA SNIPE (Gallinago andina) 3, Jun 22nd Pampa Curicocha and 7 birds at Lake Junin (Photo above).
- 107. Greater Yellowlegs (Tringa melanoleuca) A few noted along the west coast.
- 108. Black Skimmer (cinerascens) (Rynchops niger cinerascens) Common and in flocks at El Paraiso and Huacho.
- 109. Andean Gull (Chroicocephalus serranus) A few wandering individuals and small groups high in the Andes.
- 110. Grey-headed Gull (Chroicocephalus cirrocephalus) Common along the coast.
- 111. Grey Gull (Leucophaeus modestus) Common at the coast.



112. Belcher's Gull (Larus belcheri) A few at the coast.

- 113. Kelp Gull (Kelp) (Larus dominicanus dominicanus) A few at the coast.
- 114. Royal Tern (Thalasseus maximus) 1, El Paraiso, Huacho.
- 115. Inca Tern (Larosterna inca) Common at the coast.
- 116. Sunbittern (Eurypyga helias) 2 together on the Satipo Rd.
- 117. Humboldt Penguin (Spheniscus humboldti) 2, at Huacho and 3 at El Paraiso the next day.





- 118. **Elliot's Storm Petrel** (Oceanites gracilis) 1-3 birds just offshore at El Paraiso. We could only see the white belly patch when blowing up the photos on the back of the camera.
- 119. **Peruvian Booby** (Sula variegata) Common at the coast.
- 120. Red-legged Cormorant (Poikilocarbo gaimardi) A few at Huacho.
- 121. Neotropic Cormorant (Nannopterum brasilianum) Common.



- 122. ANDEAN IBIS (Theristicus branickii) 2, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Road and 7 the next day in the roadside fields.
- 123. **Puna Ibis** (Plegadis ridgwayi) Fairly commonly noted, mainly over 3-4000m but also a few down on the coastal plain.
- 124. Night-Heron (American) (Nycticorax nycticorax hoactli) 3 seen and a few others heard at night flying over.
- 125. Striated Heron (South American) (Butorides striata striata) 3 in the area around Villa Rica.

- 126. Cattle Egret (Bubulcus ibis) Afew seen at the lower levels.
- 127. Cocoi Heron (Ardea cocoi) 3 at Lake Onconal.
- 128. Great White Egret (American) (Ardea alba egretta) Several noted.
- 129. Little Blue Heron (Egretta caerulea) 1 noted.
- 130. Snowy Egret (Egretta thula) A few noted.
- 131. Peruvian Pelican (Pelecanus thagus) Several at the coast.
- 132. King Vulture (Sarcoramphus papa) 2 at Quebrada Frejolillo.
- 133. Andean Condor (Vultur gryphus) 4+ San Pedro de Castra area.
- 134. Black Vulture (Coragyps atratus) Common in the lowlands.
- 135. Turkey Vulture (Cathartes aura) Common in the lowlands and foothills.





- 136. **Pearl Kite** (Gampsonyx swainsonii) 2 birds, Jun 15th Mocupe to Rafan road.
- 137. Grey-headed Kite (Leptodon cayanensis) A single bird at Hacienda Amorique.
- 138. Swallow-tailed Kite (Elanoides forficatus) Several Hacienda Amorique.
- 139. Black Hawk-eagle (Spizaetus tyrannus) 1, Hacienda Amorique.
- 140. Cinereous Harrier (Circus cinereus) 1 near Mocupe.
- 141. Plumbeous Kite (Ictinia plumbea) 2, Hacienda Amorique.
- 142. Snail Kite (Rostrhamus sociabilis) 1, Lake Onconal.
- 143. Roadside Hawk (Southern) (Rupornis magnirostris [pucherani-group]) A few noted from Villa Rica to Hacienda Amorique.
- 144. Harris's Hawk (Harris's) (Parabuteo unicinctus harrisi) A couple of birds along the west coastal roads.
- 145. Variable Hawk (Geranoaetus polyosoma) Common.
- 146. Black-chested Buzzard-eagle (Geranoaetus melanoleucus) c8 birds seen in all, commonest around San Pedro de Castra.
- 147. **Short-tailed Hawk** (Buteo brachyurus) A few around Hacienda Amorique and environs.
- 148. Zone-tailed Hawk (Buteo albonotatus) 1 near Chiclayo.



149. **American Barn Owl** (American) (Tyto furcata [tuidara-group]) A pair, Lake Junin, above, and another bird nesting just off the town square in a building roof at Conception 2 blocks from the Hotel Paraiso.



150. **Burrowing Owl (Littoral)** (Athene cunicularia nanodes/juninensis)
A few noted along the west coast drier areas being common at Lomas de Lachay and Lomas de Asia.



151. YUNGAS PYGMY OWL (Glaucidium bolivianum) 1, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd and 1, above, Calabaza on Jun 27th.



152. Pacific Pygmy Owl (Glaucidium peruanum) Common and aggressive along the west slope up to at least 3200m asl.





153. KOEPCKE'S SCREECH OWL (KOEPCKE'S) (Megascops koepckeae koepckeae) 1, Jul 13th PN Huascaran at dusk by the lakeside restaurant (top photo).

(APURIMAC) (Megascops koepckeae hockingi) 1-2 birds, Jun 28th Andamarca (lower photo).

Both ssp were very easy to see at dusk and very vocal.





- 154. **Rufescent Screech Owl (Rufescent)** (Megascops ingens ingens/venezuelanus) 1, Jul 4th above left, and 3 more heard at Hacienda Amorique. Tracked it down to the edge of the forest thinking it was going to be a Cloud-forest Screech Owl, which it clearly wasn't. The song sounds very similar and the birds respond to Cloud-forest Screech Owl song too!
- 155. **WEST PERUVIAN SCREECH OWL** (**PACIFICUS**) (Megascops roboratus pacificus) 1, Jun 15th along the walking track from the small settlement of Limon towards Quebrada Frejolillo before dawn with another 2 heard calling along there.

 This bird was very responsive and had signs of heavy feather loss on the back of the head (photo above right).



156. **BAND-BELLIED OWL** (Pulsatrix melanota) Rufous-banded Owl (Strix albitarsus) A pair, Jul 1st Lake Onconal at dusk calling by the parking area at the Vista Hermosa Restaurante. The paler bird on the right called frequently and thought to be the male.

- 157. Rufous-banded Owl (Strix albitarsus) A large silhouette in flight was all that was seen of a calling bird at Hacienda Amorique.
- 158. Golden-headed Quetzal (Pharomachrus auriceps) At least 5 lekking birds at Calabaza and also 1 at the Carpish Tunnel.
- 159. Black-tailed Trogon (Black-tailed) (Trogon melanurus melanurus/eumorphus) 1-2 males at Quebrada Frejollilo.
- 160. Blue-crowned Trogon (Trogon curucui) Male at Hacienda Amorique.
- 161. Amazon Kingfisher (Chloroceryle amazona) 2 on the way to Hacienda Amorique.
- 162. Andean Motmot (Momotus aequatorialis) 3, Calabaza and 1 Bosque Shollet.
- 163. Bluish-fronted Jacamar (Galbula cyanescens) 2, Hacienda Amorique.



- 164. **BLACK-STREAKED PUFFBIRD** (Malacoptila fulvogularis) 3, Jul 4th Hacienda Amorique. The birds were all together and possibly a family group. The strange wispy call was heard a couple of times elsewhere here but the birds remained hidden.
- 165. Lanceolated Monklet (Micromonacha lanceolata) 1, Jul 3rd Hacienda Amorique.
- 166. **RUFOUS-CAPPED NUNLET** (Nonnula ruficapilla) 2, Jul 2nd and 1 on Jul 5th Hacienda Amorique.



167. Versicolored Barbet (Blue-chinned) (Eubucco versicolor glaucogularis) 1 at Calabaza and 3 at Hacienda Amorique.



168. **BLACK-THROATED TOUCANET** (Aulacorhynchus atrogularis) 4, Jul 3rd and 6 the next day at Hacienda Amorique.



169. **BLUE-BANDED TOUCANET** (Aulacorhynchus coeruleicinctis) 2, Jun 27th Calabaza trying to hide in the canopy.

170. **Chestnut-eared Aracari** (Pteroglossus castanotis) 3, Jul 2nd attemting to rob some nests but being mobbed off.

171. **Grey-breasted Mountain Toucan** (Andigena hypoglauca) 2, Jun 27th Calabaza.





- 173. SCARLET-BACKED WOODPECKER (Veniliornis callonotus) Pair, Jun 15th Limon (photos above) and 2 at Bosque El Canoncillo.
- 174. **Yellow-vented Woodpecker** (Veniliornis dignus) 1, Jul 1st Villa Rica.



- 175. BAR-BELLIED WOODPECKER (Veniliornis nigriceps)
 1, Jul 8th at the Carpish Tunnel. Much darker underneath at this location than illustrated or photod elsewhere.
- 176. **Golden-olive Woodpecker** (**Golden-olive**) (Colaptes rubiginosus [rubiginosus-group]) Male Jul 4th Hacienda Amorique.
- 177. **Crimson-mantled Woodpecker (Crimson-mantled)** (Colaptes rivolii [rivolii-group]) 1, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd.



178. **BLACK-NECKED WOODPECKER** (Colaptes atricollis) Pair, Jun 15th Quebrada Frejollilo, 1+ and 2 heard at San Pedro de Castra. Also, single birds Jul 15th Valle Marca (photo above) and another on Jul 21st.



179. **Andean Flicker** (Northern) (Colaptes rupicola cinereicapillus) 6, Jul 13th PN Huascaran (photo) and 2 to El Molino and also 2 at Balsas.

(Southern) (Colaptes rupicola rupicola/puna) 20+ in the high Andes from Junin north to Huanuco.

180. Lineated Woodpecker (Lineated) (Dryocopus lineatus [lineatus-group]) 3 at Hacienda Amorique.

181. Crimson-crested Woodpecker (Campephilus melanoleucos) 1, Hacienda Amorique.



- 182. **RED-THROATED CARACARA** (Ibycter americanus) 3, Jul 2nd Hacienda Amorique came in noisily and one perched up by the Hacienda in a bare tree occasionally calling to the others before they all flew off just over the canopy. Totally unexpected to see these here but a great surprise.
- 183. Mountain Caracara (Phalcoboenus megalopterus) c 30 birds seen all, alwaysat the highest altitudes.
- 184. **Crested Caracara** (Caracara plancus) 2 while driving south somewhere near Chiclayo.
- 185. Yellow-headed Caracara (Milvago chimachima) 1 Lake Onconal.
- 186. Barred Forest Falcon (Micrastur ruficollis) 1 at Hacienda Amorique.
- 187. American Kestrel (South American) (Falco sparverius [cinnamominus-group]) Fairly regularly noted.
- 188. Aplomado Falcon (Falco femoralis) Pair at Junin.
- 189. **Orange-breasted Falcon** (Falco deiroleucus) 1, Carpish Tunnel identified from Dans swift-actioned photos of an overhead flyer... excellent work Dan!



190. ANDEAN PARAKEET (Bolborhynchus orbygnesius) 40+, Jun 24th sth of Huanaco in a feeding group found by Dan.



- 191. Plum-crowned Parrot (Pionus tumultuosus) c30 at Calabaza.
- 192. Blue-headed Parrot (Blue-headed) (Pionus menstruus rubrigularis/menstruus) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.



193. Pacific Parrotlet (Forpus coelestis) common on the west slope.



194. **YELLOW-FACED PARROTLET** (Forpus xanthops) 2+ and several others heard only, Jul 25th, Balsas.



195. **CORDILLERAN PARAKEET** (Psittacara frontatus) 22 birds in a flock, Jul 15th Valle Marca in the morning.

A superb big flock of this scarce bird surprising us as we got out of the car. Photo below for comparison with Red-masked.



196. **RED-MASKED PARAKEET** (Psittacara erythrogenys) 50, Jun 14th and 100+ 0n 15th Quebrada Frejollilo, firstly at the evening roost and then in the morning leaving the roost and in the forest in the morning. Photo above left.

- 197. Coastal Miner (Geositta peruviana)
- 198. **SLENDER-BILLED MINER** (Geositta tenuirostris) 1, Jun 22nd on the road to Pampa Curicocha.
- 199. Common Miner (Altiplano) (Geositta cunicularia [frobeni-group]) Noted at Junin, towards Calabaza and Huancayo.



200. **Thick-billed Miner** (Geositta crassirostris) 2 at Lomas de Lachay, and common at Lomas de Asia.



201. **Greyish Miner** (Geositta maritima) 3, Lomas de Lachay.



202. **DARK-WINGED MINER** (Geositta saxicolina) 5, Jun 23rd Junin.

- 203. Olivaceous Woodcreeper (Amazonian) (Sittasomus griseicapillus [griseicapillus-group]) 2, Hacienda Amorique.
- 204. Plain-brown Woodcreeper (Plain-brown) (Dendrocincla fuliginosa [meruloides-group]) 4+ Hacienda Amorique at antswarm.
- 205. Wedge-billed Woodcreeper (Glyphorynchus spirurus) 2 on the Satipo Rd.
- 206. Black-banded Woodcreeper (Dendrocolaptes picuminus) 2 at Hacienda Amorique at an ant swarm.
- 207. Streak-headed Woodcreeper (Lepidocolaptes souleyetii) A couple in the Tumbes.
- 208. Montane Woodcreeper (warscewiczi Group) (Lepidocolaptes lacrymiger [warscewiczi-group])



- 209. INAMBARI WOODCREEPER (Lepidocolaptes fatimalimae) Only at Hacienda Amorique where 2, Jul 2nd, 6 on 3rd and 1 on 4th.
- 210. Streaked Xenops (Xenops rutilans) 6 Hacienda Amorique.
- 211. Streaked Tuftedcheek (Pseudocolaptes boissonneautii) 2, Calabaza and 2 at the Carpish Tunnel.
- 212. Pacific Hornero (Furnarius cinnamomeus) Common up in the Tumbes area.
- 213. Wren-like Rushbird (Phleocryptes melanops) 1 at El Paraiso, Huacho.



214. **STRIATED EARTHCREEPER** (Geocerthia serrana) 2, Jun 22nd before Quebrada Yanac, and 2 at PN Huascaran where photod.

215. **Buff-breasted Earthcreeper (Plain-breasted)** (Upucerthia validirostris jelskii/saturata) Single birds on the way to, and at Lake Junin.



216. Cream-winged Cinclodes (Cinclodes albiventris) Common throughout.



217. WHITE-BELLIED CINCLODES (Cinclodes palliatus) 1-2, Jun 22nd Pampa Curicocha.

Took a bit of a search but eventually found well away from the road and was moving around fairly quickly while feeding.



- 218. **PERUVIAN SEASIDE CINCLODES** (Cinclodes taczanowskii) 1, Jun 12th Tuquillo Beach just north of Huarmey in the evening.
- 219. Montane Foliage-gleaner (Anabacerthia striaticollis) Several at Hacienda Amorique.
- 220. Pearled Treerunner (Margarornis squamiger) Noted at Calabaza, Bosque Shollet and Bosque Unchog.



- 221. RUSTY-CROWNED TIT-SPINETAIL (STREAK-CROWNED) (Leptasthenura pileata cajabambae)
 8+ in the Santa Eulalia Valley at San Pedro de Castra and 8 at PN Huascaran where photod above left.
- 222. Streak-backed Tit-Spinetail (Leptasthenura striata)c4 at San Pedro de Castra. 4 birds in all at San Pedro de Castra where photod above right.



223. **CHESTNUT-BACKED THORNBIRD** (Phacellodomus dorsalis) 3, Jul 23rd Balsas, with a few more heard only.




224. PALE-TAILED CANASTERO (PALE-TAILED) (Asthenes huancavelicae huancavelicae) 6+, Jul 14th Rinconada and also c 7-800m sth of that hill back along the track here https://maps.app.goo.gl/NvYeFVCMma4pvDUx9 where better views and photod.

- 225. Many-striped Canastero (Asthenes flammulata) Common at Bosque Unchog.
- 226. **Junin Canastero** (Asthenes virgata) 1 at Lake Junin with Cesar.





227. **STREAK-THROATED CANASTERO** (Asthenes humilis) 2, Jun 23rd Lake Junin, 1 at the high pass on the Pariahuanca Rd and common in PN Huascaran where photod above.





229. **EYE-RINGED THISTLETAIL** (Asthenes palpebralis) 4, Jun 26th https://maps.app.goo.gl/Hy9Cj4Vq1GUyZTJC6 at a random stop along the road and a bit further along. Also another bird seen the next day closer to Calabaza.

230. White-chinned Thistletail (Asthenes fuliginosa peruviana/plengei) 4 seen at Bosque Unchog photo right.





231. VILCABAMBA SPINETAIL (Cranioleuca weskei) 1, Jun 28th near Calabza. Just split from Marcapata Spinetail.



- 232. Creamy-crested Spinetail (Cranioleuca albicapilla) 4 Huancayo (above left) and 2 on the Pariahuanca Rd.
- 233. Ash-browed Spinetail (Cranioleuca curtata) 1 Lake Onconal and 1 at Hacienda Amorique photo above right.
- 234. Line-cheeked Spinetail (BARON'S) (Cranioleuca antisiensis)
 2, Jul 8th above Cochabamba (photo right).
 2 at PN Huascaran.
- 235. **Cactus Canastero** (Pseudasthenes cactorum) 2 at Lomas de Lachay.





236. **GREAT SPINETAIL** (Synallaxis hypochondriaca) 2, Jul 21st Jesus near Cajabamba. See daily log for details.



- 237. **NECKLACED SPINETAIL** (Synallaxis stictothorax) 25, Jun 13th Chao (photo above left) and another 8 on 15th-16th Jun.
- 238. **RUSSET-BELLIED SPINETAIL** (Synallaxis zimmeri) 2+, Jul 15th Valle Marca (above right).
- 239. CABANIS'S SPINETAIL (Synallaxis cabanisi) 1, Jul 5th Hacienda Amorique was very secretive and hard to see in the dense gully although one was probably seen well out in the open when we arrived, but brushed off as an Azara's.
- 240. Azara's Spinetail (Azara's) (Synallaxis azarae [azarae-group]) 2, Lake Onconal.
- 241. Rufous Spinetail (Peruvian) (Synallaxis unirufa ochrogaster) 2 Calabaza and 2 at the Carpish Tunnel.



242. **RUFESCENT ANTSHRIKE** (Thamnistes rufescens) 1, Jun 29th Satipo Rd in a moving mixed flock. Identified later from photos.



243. **STRIPE-CHESTED ANTWREN** (Myrmotherula longicauda) Male, Jun 3rd (photo above) and a female the next day and 2 more on Jul 5th at the ant swarm at Hacienda Amorique.



244. **CREAMY-BELLIED ANTWREN** (Herpsilochmus motacilloides) 1, Jul 1st on the road up to Bosque Shollet where photod above, and another 2 birds at Hacienda Amorique on Jul 3rd.

- 245. Collared Antshrike (Collared) (Thamnophilus bernardi bernardi) Male at Quebrada Frejollilo.
- 246. Chestnut-backed Antshrike (Thamnophilus palliatus) 3 in total at Hacienda Amorique.
- 247. Streak-headed Antbird (Drymophila striaticeps) 1, Hacienda Amorique.
- 248. YELLOW-BREASTED WARBLING ANTBIRD (Hypocnemis subflava) 1-2 birds, Jul 5th at Hacienda Amorique at the ant swarm.
- 249. Blackish Antbird (Cercomacroides nigrescens) 1, Hacienda Amorique.
- 250. White-browed Antbird (Myrmoborus leucophrys) A female at the ant swarm at Hacienda Amorique.
- 251. **UNDULATED ANTPITTA** (Grallaria squamigera) 1, Jul 9th Bosque Unchog with another 2 birds heard calling before on Jul 7th. This bird was watched with Graham down in Dans hole... a trail which Dan had made into the mossy forest a few days before and where we had seen several good birds. The bird started calling straight and suddenly we could see movement and then a short while later it scuttled into view ... Spectacular!! but unfortunately for me too fast for any photos. Very much under illustrated in field guides failing to show the brightness and colour. Blue-grey upperparts and pale peachy orange underparts and face with blackish crescents all across the underparts. A great experience!!



252. **Stripe-headed Antpitta (Stripe-headed)** (Grallaria andicolus andicolus) Noted at the Pariahuanca Rd and PN Huascaran where quite common (photo above).



253. **BAY ANTPITTA** (Grallaria capitalis) 1, Jun 27th Calabaza and a few others heard only. Tricky to see well.





- 254. CAJAMARCA ANTPITTA (Grallaria cajamarcae) 1 and another heard, Jul 24th https://maps.app.goo.gl/mZsdaQzotW9JcBSC9
- 255. **CHACHAPOYAS ANTPITTA** (Grallaria gravesi) 2, Jul 7th Bosque Unchog.





- 256. PANAO ANTPITTA (Grallaria oneilli) 3 seen and another 4 heard, Jul 10th. Montepotrero. Very common and easy to see here.
- 257. JUNIN ANTPITTA (Grallaria obscura) 1, Jun 27th Puente Carrizales. https://maps.app.goo.gl/38TH4PVF1q9fKTXo9



258. **OXAPAMPA ANTPITTA** (Grallaria centralis) 1, Jun 27th West of Calabaza along the road near Puente Carrizales.

- 259. **CHESTNUT ANTPITTA** (Grallaria blakei) 1, Jul 8th Carpish Tunnel where a further 6 heard. Not fast enough for a photo as it just suddenly appeared 2m away for a few seconds. Watched again when the others arrived and the best views were without bins as it was so close and mobile.
- 260. **RUFOUS-BREASTED ANTPITTA** (Grallaricula leymebambae) 2, Jun 30th Bosque Shollet opposite the watchtower. They both showed well although briefly several times often perching c 2m up on a tree fern frond.



- 261. ANCASH TAPACULO (Scytalopus affinis) Ad and a juv, Jul 13th PN Huascaran.
- 262. WHITE-WINGED TAPACULO (Scytalopus krabbei) 1 heard only at Bosque Unchog Jul 10th.



- 263. JALCA TAPACULO (Scytalopus frankeae) 1+, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd and another heard.
- 264. NEBLINA TAPACULO (Scytalopus altirostris) Lots heard at Bosque Unchog every day but just couldn't see one.
- 265. TRILLING TAPACULO (Scytalopus parvirostris) 1, Jul 1st Bosque Shollet watched singing.
- 266. WHITE-CROWNED TAPACULO (Scytalopus atratus) Lots heard only at Hacienda Amorique.
- 267. LARGE-FOOTED TAPACULO (Scytalopus macropus) 1+, Jul 7th and 9th Bosque Unchog where glimpsed by the speaker on 9th but not ticked as too brief.
- 268. **JUNIN TAPACULO** (Scytalopus gettyae) 1, Jun 28th road to Andamarca.

- 269. **UNICOLORED TAPACULO** (Scytalopus unicolor) 1, Jul 20th El Molino watched closely singingat the 1st bend from the road.
- 270. TSCHUDI'S TAPACULO (Scytalopus acutirostris) 1, Jun 7th and 10th Bosque Unchog watched singing.



- 271. MARANON CRESCENTCHEST (Melanopareia maranonica) 2, Jul 24th between Celendin and Llanguat. Tricky to see.
- 272. **ELEGANT CRESCENTCHEST** (Melanopareia elegans) 1, Jun 16th and another 2 heard only, at Zapotal on the track from the car park up to the houses.
- 273. Ashy-headed Tyrannulet (Phyllomyias cinereiceps) 1 heard at Hacienda Amorique.
- 274. **SIERRAN ELAENIA** (Elaenia pallatangae) 5, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd where the call was learned and then a few more at Calabaza to Andamarca, Hacienda Amorique and quite common at Montepotrero.



- 275. Southern Beardless Tyrannulet (Camptostoma obsoletum) Often noted in the drier areas in the lowlands.
- 276. White-throated Tyrannulet (Mecocerculus leucophrys) Noted at Pariahuanca Rd, Calabaza and Bosque Unchog.
- 277. White-banded Tyrannulet (Mecocerculus stictopterus) Noted at Calabaza, Carpish Tunnel and Montepotrero.
- 278. **BLACK-CRESTED TIT-TYRANT** (Anairetes nigrocristatus) 1, Jul 8th above Cochabamba in the scrubby farmland. Also another on Jul 10th at Montepotrero.



279. PIED-CRESTED TIT-TYRANT (Anairetes reguloides) 2, Jun 20th and 6+the next day at San Pedro de Castra.

- 280. Yellow-billed Tit-tyrant (Anairetes flavirostris) Noted near Quebrada Yanac, sth of Huancayo and 2 at Valle Marca.
- 281. **Tufted Tit-tyrant** (Anairetes parulus) 2-3 San Pedro de Castra and 1 on 11th at Bosque Unchog.
- 282. **Torrent Tyrannulet** (Serpophaga cinerea) Noted on the Satipo Rd and near Celendin.



283. **TUMBESIAN TYRANNULET** (Nesotriccus tumbezanus) 3+, Jun 13th Chao (photo above), and a further 4-5 14th-17th Jun.





284. MARANON TYRANNULET (Nesotriccus maranonicus) 5, Jul 23rd Balsas.





285. **FULVOUS-FACED SCRUB TYRANT** (Euscarthmus fulviceps) 4+, Jun 13th Chao often calling. Fairly common in the Tumbesian and Maranon sites with the highest count of 15 along the road to Balsas. **Split from Tawny-crowned Pygmy-Tyrant.**

286. **GREY-AND-WHITE TYRANNULET** (Pseudelaenia leucospodia) 4+, Jun 14th on the drive to Limon and a few at roadside stops on the drive south from Olmos.

- 287. Peruvian Tyrannulet (Zimmerius viridiflavus) 4+ at Hacienda Amorique.
- 288. Marble-faced Bristle Tyrant (Pogonotriccus ophthalmicus) 1, at the Satipo Rd and 2 singles at Hacienda Amorique.
- 289. Mottle-cheeked Tyrannulet (Phylloscartes ventralis) 6+ at Bosque Shollet.
- 290. **Streak-necked Flycatcher** (Mionectes striaticollis) Noted at Calabaza and the Satipo Rd, Bosque Shollet and Hacienda Amorique.
- 291. Olive-striped Flycatcher (Mionectes galbinus) Noted at Calabaza.
- 292. Slaty-capped Flycatcher (superciliaris) (Leptopogon superciliaris superciliaris) 2, Jun 30th Bosque Shollet.
- 293. INCA FLYCATCHER (Leptopogon taczanowskii) 1, Jun 29th Satipo Rd, 1 Bosque Shollet and 1 at the Carpish Tunnel.





- 294. MOUSE-GREY FLYCATCHER (Myiophobus crypterythrus) Singles on Jul 22nd and 23rd Balsas, both times being quite shy when in a mobbing Pygmy Owl flock. Both Mouse-grey and Rufescant Flycatcher are now split from Bran-coloured Flycatcher.
- 295. RUFESCENT FLYCATCHER (Myiophobus rufescens) Single birds on Jun 12th near Barranca and Jun 13th at Chao (photo above).
- 296. Ochraceous-breasted Flycatcher (Nephelomyias ochraceiventris) 3, Jul 7th Bosque Unchog.
- 297. Many-colored Rush Tyrant (Tachuris rubrigastra) 10+ Lake Junin from the boat trip.
- 298. Black-throated Tody-tyrant (Hemitriccus granadensis) 1, Jun 28th towards Andamarca.



299. WHITE-BELLIED PYGMY TYRANT (Myiornis albiventris) 1, Jul 5th Hacienda Amorique just 100m down from the Hacienda.

- 300. Scale-crested Pygmy Tyrant (Lophotriccus pileatus) Common at Hacienda Amorique.
- 301. Common Tody-Flycatcher (cinereum Group) (Todirostrum cinereum [cinereum-group]) 2, Bosque Shollet.
- 302. Cinnamon Flycatcher (Pyrrhomyias cinnamomeus) Several between Calabaza and Satipo.
- 303. Black Phoebe (White-winged) (Sayornis nigricans latirostris/angustirostris) A few along foothill streams.
- 304. Smoke-colored Pewee (Contopus fumigatus) 3 in the Calabaza area.





- 305. TUMBES PEWEE (Contopus punensis) 1+, Jul 15th Valle Marca, 1+ at Jesus and 1, above at Balsas.
- 306. Scarlet Flycatcher (Pyrocephalus rubinus) Common on the west slope, more so in the lowlands.
- 307. Little Ground Tyrant (Syrtidicola fluviatilis) 1 by the river c20miles sth of Villa Rica.
- 308. Spot-billed Ground Tyrant (Muscisaxicola maculirostris) 1 San Pedro de Castra.





- 309. White-fronted Ground Tyrant (Muscisaxicola albifrons) 6+ on Jun 22nd driving to Junin reaching over 5000m asl at times.
- 310. **Ochre-naped Ground Tyrant** (Muscisaxicola flavinucha) 2, Jun 22nd driving to Junin reaching over 5000m asl at times. Also, several the next day at Junin.





- 311. **TACZANOWSKI'S GROUND TYRANT** (Muscisaxicola griseus) 2, Jun 22nd driving to Junin reaching over 5000m asl at times. Quite confused with the id so made a point of getting photos at the next available time which was at PN Huascaran where 3 birds were watched on Jul 13th and photod, above. Plain cap/nape and a white super which often protruded away from the crown feathers slightly behind the eye.
- 312. Cinereous Ground Tyrant (Muscisaxicola cinereus) 1+ along the Pariahuanca Rd.
- 313. **Rufous-naped Ground Tyrant (Chestnut-naped)** (Muscisaxicola rufivertex occipitalis) 2 Jun 22nd along the road to Junin.
- 314. Dark-faced Ground Tyrant (mentalis) (Muscisaxicola maclovianus mentalis) 6, Lomas de Asia.
- 315. Andean Negrito (Lessonia oreas) c9 seen in all.
- 316. White-winged Black Tyrant (White-winged) (Knipolegus aterrimus aterrimus/anthracinus) Single birds sth of Huancayo and the Andamarca Valley.
- 317. **RUFOUS-TAILED TYRANT** (Knipolegus poecilurus) 1, Jun 26th Calabaza just above the town on the road to Andamarca.
- 318. **Rufous-webbed Bush Tyrant** (Cnemarchus rufipennis) 1, Jul 12th on route to, and 5 at PN Huascaran.



319. Streak-throated Bush Tyrant (Myiotheretes striaticollis) c7 noted in all.

- 320. **RUFOUS-BELLIED BUSH TYRANT** (Myiotheretes fuscorufus) 1, Jul 6th Bosque Unchog which, while watching it led me onto a Bay-vented Cotinga. Perching on the tops of bushes at the forest edge in the evening,
- 321. Black-billed Shrike-tyrant (Agriornis montanus) 3, Lake Junin and singles 6th and 15th Jul.
- 322. WHITE-TAILED SHRIKE-TYRANT (Agriornis albicauda) 1, Jun 22nd at c5000m asl on the road west of Pampa Curicocha. The bird was on wires at the side of the road before flying off, hovering and the dropping onto a mouse. It then perched up on a roadside boulder with the mouse concealing the bill tip detail. The bird however looked very large and powerfull and what I could see of the bill looked deep. The head was noticeably squareish and the tail had a lot of dull buffy colouration to it. It immediately looked like White-tailed and despite giving the area a search we failed to find it again. Next day we saw 3 Black billed Shrike-Tyrants which looked very noticeably slighter, slimmer and less powerful looking especially in the head and bill.



323. **TUMBES TYRANT** (Tumbezia salvini) 1+, Jun 13th Chao (photo above), 2 along the roadside driving out from Limon on 15th and another sth of Olmos on 16th.



- 324. KALINOWSKI'S CHAT-TYRANT (Silvicultrix spodionota) 2, Jul 9th Bosque Unchog photo above left.
- 325. JELSKI'S CHAT-TYRANT (Silvicultrix jelskii) 2, Jul 24th west of Celendin at the same gully as the Cajamarca Antpitta.





- 326. MAROON-BELTED CHAT-TYRANT (Ochthoeca thoracica) Pair, Jun 27th Calabaza.
- 327. Rufous-breasted Chat-tyrant (Ochthoeca rufipectoralis) 4 in the Calabaza area.
- 328. Brown-backed Chat-tyrant (Ochthoeca fumicolor) 3 at Bosque Unchog in total.
- 329. **D'Orbigny's Chat-tyrant** (Ochthoeca oenanthoides) 4, Quebrada Yanac.
- 330. White-browed Chat-tyrant (Ochthoeca leucophrys) 3, sth of Huancayo, 2 along the Pariahuanca Rd and 2 Valle Marca.
- 331. PIURA CHAT-TYRANT (Ochthoeca piurae) 1+, Jul 15th Valle Marca seen 3 times briefly but fully out in the open.
- 332. Long-tailed Tyrant (Colonia colonus) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.



- 333. Short-tailed Field Tyrant (Muscigralla brevicauda) 2+ at Chao where photod, 2+ at Gramadal and also at Lomas de Lachay.
- 334. Social Flycatcher (Social) (Myiozetetes similis [similis-group]) Noted at the Satipo Rd, Villa Rica and Hacienda Amorique.





- 335. **LEMON-BROWED FLYCATCHER** (Conopias cinchoneti) 4, Jun 29th on the Satipo Rd where photod and also 2 Jun 5th.
- 336. Golden-crowned Flycatcher (Myiodynastes chrysocephalus) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.
- 337. Baird's Flycatcher (Myiodynastes bairdii) Common ata Quebrada Frejollilo and also in the general Tumbes area.





- 338. SNOWY-THROATED KINGBIRD (Tyrannus niveigularis) 3 birds, Jun 15th on the drive out from Limon.
- 339. **Tropical Kingbird** (Tyrannus melancholicus) Regular in the lowlands on the east slope.
- 340. **RUFOUS FLYCATCHER** (Myiarchus semirufus) 2, Jun 17th at Rafan photo above right.
- 341. Pale-edged Flycatcher (Myiarchus cephalotes) 2 birds at Hacienda Amorique.



342. MASKED FRUITEATER (Pipreola pulchra) Male, Jul 1st Bosque Shollet with a female seen by the others.



343. Barred Fruiteater (Pipreola arcuata) c4 at Bosque Unchog and c4 at the Carpish Tunnel.



344. BAND-TAILED FRUITEATER (INTERMEDIA) (Pipreola intermedia intermedia) 2, Jun 27th near Calabaza.



345. **Andean Cock-of-the-rock** (Rupicola peruvianus) A superb male, Jun 29th on the Satipo Rd at the side of the track.




346. WHITE-CHEEKED COTINGA (Zaratornis stresemanni) 5, Jun 22nd Quebrada Yanac, all tatty and mobile. 1 at PN Huascaran.



347. **BAY-VENTED COTINGA** (Doliornis sclateri) 1, Jul 6th Bosque Unchog and another 2 on 7th.



348. PERUVIAN PLANTCUTTER (Phytotoma raimondii) 2 males, Jun 12th Gramadal where c 6+ seen Jul 15th including the female above right. Also 3 birds at Rafan while watching Rufous Flycatcher.





350. **AMAZONIAN UMBRELLABIRD** (Cephalopterus ornatus) A male, Jun 29th on the Satipo Rd impressively found and identified by Dan from the car as we were driving to Satipo.







351. **CERULEAN-CAPPED MANAKIN** (Lepidothrix coeruleocapilla) 2 males, Jun 3rd and just 1 male the next day At Hacienda Amorique. Stunning display flight watched at close quarters and just below us in the gloom of the forest undergrowth as a (younger?) male circled the perched male for several minutes. The flying bird always faced the perched bird and appeared to fly sideways in a perfect circle with its head bowed showing off its bright blue crown. Mesmerising to watch!

352. White-crowned Manakin (Pseudopipra pipra) A female at Hacienda Amorique.



353. **ROUND-TAILED MANAKIN** (Ceratopipra chloromeros)
10 males and 2 females lekking, (moonwalking!) Jun 2nd Hacienda Amorique.



- 355. **CRYPTIC BECARD** (Pachyramphus salvini) A pair, Jun 15th on the way out from Limon. Formerly lumped within Black-and-white Becard, this was split while I was away and although I will have seen it in western Ecuador this is the first photo evidence according with the paper for me. Apart from the range, and dryer and disturbed habitat the birds were in, other features visable on the photos are labelled above and were used to compare this female with online photos in the ranges of Cryptic and Black-and-white Becards.

 Treat Pachyramphus salvini as a separate species from P. albogriseus (Isu.edu)
- 356. Rufous-browed Peppershrike (Cyclarhis gujanensis) 1 noted.
- 357. OLIVACEOUS GREENLET (Hylophilus olivaceus) 1, Jul 4th calling in a mixed flock at Hacienda Amorique. Difficult to see!
- 358. Chivi Vireo (Vireo chivi) 4+ noted on the Satipo Rd and at Hacienda Amorique.
- 359. Brown-capped Vireo (Southern) (Vireo leucophrys [leucophrys-group]) 1, Hacienda Amorique.



360. WHITE-COLLARED JAY (Cyanolyca viridicyanus) 6, Jun 27th Calabaza in a gang.



361. Violaceous Jay (Cyanocorax violaceus) A few small groups on the Satipo Rd and at Hacienda Amorique (photo above left)

362. WHITE-TAILED JAY (Cyanocorax mystacalis) 2, Jun 16th Bosque de Pomac car park area (photo above right).



364. Inca Jay (Cyanocorax yncas) 4 at the Satipo Rd, a few at Hacienda Amorique (photo) and a few at Balsas.









- 365. **TUMBES SWALLOW** (Tachycineta stolzmanni) 10+, Jun 17th Bosque El Canoncillo feeding over the dunes and drinking at the small pool there. Seems to be a reliable site.
- 366. White-winged Swallow (Tachycineta albiventer) A few birds along the river Jun 30th and Jul 2nd.
- 367. White-banded Swallow (Atticora fasciata) 6 on Jun 30th.
- 368. **Blue-and-white Swallow** (Pygochelidon cyanoleuca) Common.
- 369. **Brown-bellied Swallow** (Orochelidon murina) A few noted up in the Andes. We were checking them for Andean Swallows but never had any, although the views were often distant or against the light.
- 370. Grey-breasted Martin (Progne chalybea) A few between Olmos and Mocupe over 3 days travelling.
- 371. Fasciated Wren (Campylorhynchus fasciatus) c10 Bosque de Pomac and a few while travelling south the next day.
- 372. Grey-mantled Wren (Odontorchilus branickii) 2, Hacienda Amorique.
- 373. **PERUVIAN WREN** (Cinnycerthia peruana) 4+ in all, Jun 27th along the Calabaza Rd, some with the distinctive white head.
- 374. **Grass Wren** (PARAMO) (Cistothorus platensis aequatorialis) 2, Jul 7th Bosque Unchog.
- 375. Coraya Wren (Pheugopedius coraya) Several at Hacienda Amorique.



- 376. **SUPERCILIATED WREN** (Cantorchilus superciliaris) 4, Jun 14th at Chao (photo). Some also on 17th at Rafan and El Canoncillo.
- 377. House Wren (Southern) (Troglodytes aedon [musculus-group]) Common.
- 378. Grey-breasted Wood Wren (Andean) (Henicorhina leucophrys leucophrys/boliviana) Noted at Bosque Shollet and Amorique.
- 379. Southern Nightingale-wren (Southern) (Microcerculus marginatus [marginatus-group]) 1 at Hacienda Amorique.



- 380. **Tropical Gnatcatcher** (MARAÑON) (Polioptila plumbea maior) Common Jul 23rd to 25th in the Balsas area.
- 381. White-browed Gnatcatcher (Polioptila bilineata) Common up in the Tumbes region west of the Maranon drainage.
- 382. Long-tailed Mockingbird (Mimus longicaudatus) Common down the west coast/ slope in dry habitat.



383. WHITE-EARED SOLITAIRE (Entomodestes leucotis) 1, Jul 1st Bosque Shollet (above) and also heard at the Carpish Tunnel.

- 384. Andean Solitaire (Myadestes ralloides) Frequently heard but only 1 seen Calabaza.
- 385. PLUMBEOUS-BACKED THRUSH (Turdus reevei) A young-looking bird, Jun 15th on the drive out from Limon.
- 386. Chiguanco Thrush (chiguanco/conradi) (Turdus chiguanco chiguanco/conradi) Fairly common.
- 387. Glossy-black Thrush (Turdus serranus) 1, Bosque Shollet.
- 388. Great Thrush (Turdus fuscater) Fairly common at the higher altitudes.
- 389. Black-billed Thrush (Amazonian) (Turdus ignobilis debilis) 1, Jul 1st Lake Onconal.



390. MARANON THRUSH (Turdus maranonicus) 4, Jul 22nd along the track to Llanguat (same as Maranon Crescentchest Jun 23rd). The birds were watched in the evening just before dusk showing really well. A strange-looking round-headed Thrush with a big round eye and a MistleThrush attitude. One of the star birds for me. Also another 4 birds on the road to Balsas the next day.



392. Peruvian Pipit (Anthus peruvianus) 6, Lomas de Lachay and c15 at Lomas de Asia where photod.



393. PUNA PIPIT (Anthus brevirostris) 1, Jul 14th Lake Conacocha.



394. PARAMO PIPIT (bogotensis Group) (Anthus bogotensis [bogotensis-group]) 7, Jul 6th -11th Bosque Unchog above right. Field guides seem useless on the separation of Puna and Paramo Pipits outside habitat preferences. Further info being researched.

- 395. Hooded Siskin (Spinus magellanicus) Regularly noted, often in small groups.
- 396. Black Siskin (Spinus atratus) 4 Santa Eulalia Valley and a few at Lake Junin. Smart birds.

397. Bronze-green Euphonia (Euphonia mesochrysa) 1, Hacienda Amorique.





- 398. YELLOW-WHISKERED BUSH TANAGER (Chlorospingus parvirostris) 3, Jun 29th on the Satipo Rd.
- 399. **Common Bush Tanager** (**Buff-breasted**) (Chlorospingus flavopectus cinereocephalus) Noted at Calabaza, the Satipo Rd, Bosque Shollet and Hacienda Amorique.
- 400. **TUMBES SPARROW** (Rhynchospiza stolzmanni) 6, Jun 15th on the rd into Limon and a few more seen at random stops around Limon and back down to Olmos.
- 401. Yellow-browed Sparrow (Ammodramus aurifrons) 1 bird noted on the Satipo Rd.
- 402. Grey-browed Brushfinch (Arremon assimilis) 1 bird noted on 2 days near Calabaza and also 1 noted near Cajamarca.
- 403. Rufous-collared Sparrow (Rufous-collared) (Zonotrichia capensis [capensis-group]) Common.





- 404. RUFOUS-EARED BRUSHFINCH (Atlapetes rufigenis) 1, Jul 12th Laguna Contaycocha & 6 at PN Huascaran Jul 13th (above).
- 405. Slaty Brushfinch (TACZANOWSKI'S) (Atlapetes schistaceus taczanowskii) 4, Jun 27th Calabaza and 5 at Bosque Unchog.
- 406. TRICOLORED BRUSHFINCH (Atlapetes tricolor) 2, Jun 26th above Calabaza.



407. Yellow-breasted Brushfinch (Atlapetes latinuchus) Noted at Balsas and toward Cajamarca in the Cajamarca Antpitta gully.





408. BAY-CROWNED BRUSHFINCH (BAY-CROWNED) (Atlapetes seebohmi seebohmi) 6, Jul 15th Valle Marca (above left).

409. **RUSTY-BELLIED BRUSHFINCH** (Atlapetes nationi) 10, Jun 20th San Pedro de Castra where subsequently common (above right).

410. BLACK-SPECTACLED BRUSHFINCH (Atlapetes melanopsis)

6, Jun 25th along the Pariahuanca Rd (photos right).





- 411. Peruvian Meadowlark (Leistes bellicosus) Common along the west coast and dry foothills.
- 412. Russet-backed Oropendola (Yellow-billed) (Psarocolius angustifrons [alfredi-group]) Sev at the Satipo Rd and Bosque Shollet.



- 413. Dusky-green Oropendola (Psarocolius atrovirens) Noted at Calabaza, the Satipo Rd and Hacienda Amorique.
- 414. **Yellow-rumped Cacique (Western)** (Cacicus cela flavicrissus/vitellinus) Lots at Satipo town arriving to roost in the evening and leaving in the morning.
- 415. **Mountain Cacique (Golden-shouldered)** (Cacicus chrysonotus leucoramphus/peruvianus) 1, Jun 27th Calabaza.



- 416. WHITE-EDGED ORIOLE (Icterus graceannae) 2, Jun 15th Quebrada Frejollilo, Limon and also 2 the next day driving south from Olmos (photo above). After checking the Macaulay Library photos it seems that a lot of White-edged Orioles do not show the white outer tail feathers illustrated in the field guide due to moult or wear.
- 417. **Shiny Cowbird** (Molothrus bonariensis) Fairly common on the west coast/ slope in drier areas.
- 418. Scrub Blackbird (Scrub) (Dives warczewiczi warczewiczi) Fairly common on the west coast/ slope in drier areas.



- 419. Black-lored Yellowthroat (Geothlypis auricularis) Seen every day in the Limon area and also 1 at Balsas Photo above.
- 420. Tropical Parula (South American) (Setophaga pitiayumi [pitiayumi-group]) 1+ at Hacienda Amorique.
- 421. Citrine Warbler (Peruvian) (Myiothlypis luteoviridis striaticeps) c6 Calabaza and a few at Bosque Unchog and Carpish Tunnel.



- 422. Black-crested Warbler (Myiothlypis nigrocristata) 3 at PN Huascaran (photo) and also on the drive west to Cajamarca Jul 24th.
- 423. **Buff-rumped Warbler** (Myiothlypis fulvicauda) 1 on the Satipo Rd.
- 424. **Grey-and-gold Warbler** (Myiothlypis fraseri) 1, Jun 15th Quebrada Frejollilo.
- 425. Three-striped Warbler (Three-striped) (Basileuterus tristriatus tristriatus/baezae) 2 on the Satipo Rd.
- 426. Slate-throated Whitestart (Myioborus miniatus) Seen at the Satipo Rd and Hacienda Amorique.
- 427. Spectacled Whitestart (Spectacled) (Myioborus melanocephalus [melanocephalus-group]) Sev at Calabaza & Bosque Unchog.





- 428. Tooth-billed Tanager (Piranga lutea) 4 along the west coast and a male (photo above) at Balsas showing the tooth well.
- 429. Golden Grosbeak (Pheucticus chrysogaster) Common up at Limon, San Pedro de Castra and the Maranon sites.
- 430. Black-backed Grosbeak (Yellow-rumped) (Pheucticus aureoventris uropygialis/terminalis) 4 at Huancayo and 1 Satipo Rd.





- 431. **GREAT INCA FINCH** (Incaspiza pulchra) 1+, Jun 20th and 3 Jun 22nd Autisha Bridge area, Santa Eulalia Valley.
- 432. **RUFOUS-BACKED INCA FINCH** (Incaspiza personata) 3, Jul 6th c12km sth of Ambo on the 3N (See Itinerary p9).







- 433. BUFF-BRIDLED INCA FINCH (Incaspiza laeta) 3, Jul 23rd down towards the bottom of the Balsas rd (photo above & top right).
- 434. **GREY-WINGED INCA FINCH** (Incaspiza ortizi) 3, Jul 23rd Balsas.
- 435. Mourning Sierra Finch (Mourning) (Rhopospina fruticeti fruticeti/peruviana) Common Santa Eulalia Valley.
- 436. Band-tailed Sierra Finch (Northern) (Rhopospina alaudina [humboldti-group]) A few noted.
- 437. Green Honeycreeper (Chlorophanes spiza) 2 at Hacienda Amorique.
- 438. Golden-collared Honeycreeper (Iridophanes pulcherrimus) 2 males at Hacienda Amorique.
- 439. Blue Dacnis (Dacnis cayana) Noted at Hacienda Amorique.
- 440. Black-faced Dacnis (Dacnis lineata) a superb male at Hacienda Amorique.
- 441. Streaked Saltator (Saltator striatipectus) Common up in the Tumbes region.

- 442. Golden-billed Saltator (Saltator aurantiirostris) Several at Huancayo.
- 443. Bananaquit (Continental) (Coereba flaveola [luteola-group]) A few up in the Tumbes.
- 444. Dull-colored Grassquit (Asemospiza obscura) c12 at Celendin and the Balsas areas.
- 445. Blue-black Grassquit (Volatinia jacarina) Common in the west and Tumbes.







446. **BLACK-AND-WHITE TANAGER** (Conothraupis speculigera) 4 seen Jun 16th but very common by voice maybe hearing 20 or more, driving back from Limon but also at Zapotal (3-4+?) around the town. Unexpectedly common! The birds were calling and singing from mainly the tops of trees often remaining obscured. They appeared to be grouped in leks singing almost continuously.

447. **Rufous-crested Tanager** (Creurgops verticalis) 1, Hacienda Amorique.

- 448. Black-goggled Tanager (Trichothraupis melanops) A female Hacienda Amorique.
- 449. Silver-beaked Tanager (Ramphocelus carbo) A few from the Satipo Rd to Bosque Shollet.



450. PARROT-BILLED SEEDEATER (Sporophila peruviana) A male, Jun 13th Chao, 5 the next day driving north and then fairly common on 15th-16th. Huge Parrot-like bill made it one of the easier Sporophilas ti identify.



451. Chestnut-throated Seedeater (Sporophila telasco) Common along the coastal fields.



452. **DRAB SEEDEATER** (Sporophila simplex) 8, Jul 14th Rinconada at c 2500m.





453. **CINEREOUS FINCH** (Piezorina cinerea) 2 males and 2 females, Jun 13th Trujillo and 2 on 14th going into Limon. Also seen at Rafan

- 454. **Grey-hooded Bush Tanager (Golden-bellied)** (Cnemoscopus rubrirostris chrysogaster) Several around Calabaza.
- 455. **DRAB HEMISPINGUS** (Pseudospingus xanthophthalmus) 2, Jun 28th Calabaza area and 1, Jul 9th Bosque Unchog.
- 456. **Collared Warbling Finch** (Poospiza hispaniolensis) 6+ along the road to Limon.



457. **RUFOUS-BROWED HEMISPINGUS** (Poospiza rufosuperciliaris) 1, July 7th and 9th Bosque Unchog down in "Dans Hole" where Dan had made a trail down into the mossy Polylepis forest and where we saw some of the difficult birds. In total and between us we had 4 sightings of this bird/species at this same location. Stunner!

^{*}As Dan quite rightly pointed out, as a Poospiza, it should be called Rufous-browed Warbling Finch, not Hemispingus.*



- 458. White-browed Hemispingus (Kleinothraupis auricularis) Noted at Calabaza (photo above), the Satipo Rd and Carpish Tunnel.
- 459. Black-eared Hemispingus (Sphenopsis melanotis) 2, Hacienda Amorique.
- 460. **Buff-bellied Tanager** (Thlypopsis inornata) 2, Jul 23rd Balsas.
- 461. **Superciliaried Hemispingus (White-bellied)** (Thlypopsis superciliaris leucogastra/insignis) Noted at Calabaza and Bosque Montepotrero.



462. Rufous-chested Tanager (Thlypopsis ornata) 4 at Valle Marca.



463. **BROWN-FLANKED TANAGER** (Thlypopsis pectoralis) 6, Jul 6th Salcachupan and 2, Jul 8th at the Carpish Tunnel.



464. PARDUSCO (Nephelornis oneilli) 2, Jul 6th and 4 on 9th Bosque Unchog. A nondescript little sneak!



- 465. **PLAIN-TAILED WARBLING FINCH** (Microspingus alticola) 5+, Jul 13th PN Huascaran.
- 466. THREE-STRIPED HEMISPINGUS (Microspingus trifasciatus) 5+, Jul 7th Bosque Unchog in a small, mobile mixed flock.
- 467. Capped Conebill (Blue-capped) (Conirostrum albifrons [atrocyaneum-group]) Noted at Calabaza and Bosque Shollet.



468. Giant Conebill (Conirostrum binghami) 5 birds in all, Jul 13th PN Huascaran, some showing very well.



- 469. Blue-backed Conebill (Bolivian) (Conirostrum sitticolor cyaneum]) A few at Calabaza.
- 470. Cinereous Conebill (Cinereous) (Conirostrum cinereum cinereum/littorale) Fairly common.



- 471. **SULPHUR-THROATED FINCH** (Sicalis taczanowskii) c90+, Jun 17th Rafan in a mobile flock.
- 472. Bright-rumped Yellow Finch (Sicalis uropigyalis) Several noted from San Pedro de Castra to Junin.
- 473. Saffron Finch (Saffron) (Sicalis flaveola flaveola/valida) Several noted along the west coast up in the north mainly.



474. **Grassland Yellow Finch** (Sicalis luteola) 200, Jun 18th Lomas de Lachay along the entrance track and c20 displaying and singing at Lomas de Asia high up in the hills there (photo above).



- 475. Greenish Yellow Finch (Sicalis olivascens) Several noted. Above photo from Santa Eulalia Valley.
- 476. Peruvian Sierra Finch (Phrygilus punensis) A few noted in the Santa Eulalia valley, Lake Junin and PN Huascaran.
- 477. Ash-breasted Sierra Finch (Geospizopsis plebejus) Fairly regular in the Andes.
- 478. **STREAKED DACNIS** (Xenodacnis petersi) 1 male and c6 female types, Jul 13th PN Huascaran.
- 479. Glacier Finch (Idiopsar speculifer) c 6 at about 5000m on 22nd Jun and also 2 on the Pariahuanca Rd.
- 480. Band-tailed Seedeater (Northern) (Catamenia analis [analoides-group]) Fairly common.



481. Plain-colored Seedeater (Catamenia inornata) A few noted, here at PN Huascaran.



- 482. Masked Flowerpiercer (melanopis) (Diglossa cyanea melanopis) Fairly common in the foothill forests.
- 483. Rusty Flowerpiercer (Diglossa sittoides) Fairly common.



484. MOUSTACHED FLOWERPIERCER (Diglossa mystacalis) 1, Jun 25th Pariahuanca Rd above left, Calabaza and Bosque Unchog.



485. **YELLOW-SCARFED TANAGER** (Iridosornis reinhardti) 5, Jun 27th Calabaza and several more at Bosque Unchog often in with other tanagers in small groups.



486. **GOLDEN-COLLARED TANAGER** (Iridosornis jelskii) 6, Jul 7th and 10 on 9th Jul Bosque Unchog.

487. Blue-and-yellow Tanager (Green-mantled) (Rauenia bonariensis darwinii) Several in the Santa Eulalia Valley and Huancayo.



488. **Streak-crowned Mountain Tanager** (Dubusia stictocephala) 2 at Calabaza, 2 at the Carpish Tunnel and 2 Bosque Unchog. Part of the recent Buff-bellied Mountain Tanager split.



- 490. Hooded Mountain Tanager (Buthraupis montana) 1, Calabaza.
- 491. Blue-capped Tanager (Blue-capped) (Sporathraupis cyanocephala [cyanocephala-group]) Fairly Common.
- 492. **Grass-green Tanager** (Chlorornis riefferii) 3, Calabaza and 1, Carpish Tunnel.



493. **GOLDEN-BACKED MOUNTAIN TANAGER** (Cnemathraupis aureodorsalis) 2-3, Jul 9th and 6+ on the 11th Bosque Unchog. Took a while to get to grips with this bird but then finally saw 8-9 in all.





495. **Scarlet-bellied Mountain Tanager (Scarlet-bellied)** (Anisognathus igniventris igniventris/ignicrissa) Several at Calabaza and common at Bosque Unchog.

- 496. Lacrimose Mountain Tanager (lacrymosus) (Anisognathus lacrymosus lacrymosus) Several at Calabaza and Bosque Unchog.
- 497. Magpie Tanager (Cissopis leverianus) 4, along the Satipo Rd.
- 498. **Spotted Tanager** (Ixothraupis punctata) Noted at Hacienda Amorique.
- 499. Yellow-bellied Tanager (Ixothraupis xanthogastra) 1, Hacienda Amorique.

- 500. **Blue-grey Tanager** (**Blue-grey**) (Thraupis episcopus [cana-group]) 2 birds Limon area and 2 at Celendin and Balsas. (**White-edged**) (Thraupis episcopus [episcopus-group]) 1, Bosque Shollet.
- 501. Silver-backed Tanager (Tambillo) (Stilpnia viridicollis fulvigula) Male, Jul 23rd Balsas.
- 502. **Blue-and-black Tanager (Spot-bellied)** (Tangara vassorii atrocoerulea) 2, Bosquet Shollet showed well enough to see the spotted underparts
- 503. Beryl-spangled Tanager (Tangara nigroviridis) 2 at Calabaza.
- 504. Blue-browed Tanager (Black-cheeked) (Tangara cyanotis lutleyi) 2 males at Hacienda Amorique.
- 505. Bay-headed Tanager (Bay-and-blue) (Tangara gyrola [albertinae-group]) 2, Hacienda Amorique.
- 506. Saffron-crowned Tanager (Tangara xanthocephala) 2 on the Satipo Rd and also at Hacienda Amorique.



- 507. **FLAME-FACED TANAGER** (**FLAME-FACED**) (Tangara parzudakii parzudakii/urubambae) 1, Jun 26th and 27th Calabaza.
- 508. Golden Tanager (Southern) (Tangara arthus [pulchra-group]) Noted on the Satipo Rd and Hacienda Amorique.
